USPS Mail Handling Damage

ary 2018 newsletter. I have come across this "circular cut-out" on the bottom of my mail many times in the past.

So what causes this? Obviously it happens somewhere during the USPS automated mail handling process in one of their facilities.

> But what

causes this is unknown to me. Best I can figure is that an envelope is resting on top of a rapidly turning "roller" of some sort, that man-




aged to cut a partial circle into the bottom of the mail piece.

Above is another look (cropped & magnified) of the reverse side of the newsletter above. It shows that this is a clean cut of a partial circle at the bottom of the newsletter (which has the various pages offset slightly due to 5+ sheets of paper being folded and then sta-



pled - but that doesn't matter).

Below are two more examples, the first one on an SASE that I had sent to someone and the second on an envelope sent me back



in 2014. They both show shows circular cut-outs, but not as cleanly. While it appears that all of these are items that are fairly wide mail pieces (i.e.: 81/2" to 9"), it also happens to smaller envelopes such as the one at top right. This was on a Spanish ATM stamp issued at the Taipei 2023 International Stamp Exhibition. Unfortunately the damage does reduce the value of this item a bit, but it does show that it was actually mailed. Note: The envelope shows a "Tarifa C" rate, which should technically be "Tarifa D". The deficiency in postage is on the back with an additional €0.35 in postage. The envelope was probably carried back to Spain from the Taiwan show by Correos and then mailed from there to the US.

It would be great if someone from the USPS could shed some light as to how & what damages these envelopes during mail handling; as this could also result in items inside the envelope to get a small "cut-out", such as documents, photographs and of course stamps that might be at the bottom of the envelope.

USPS To Raise Rates in 2024

The USPS announced that they would be raising postage rates again on January 21, 2024, subject to approval by the PRC (Postal Rate Commission).

First Class postage is set to increase from 66¢ to 68¢ and International First Class (1 ounce) is to increase from \$1.50 to \$1.55. Other rates will probably increase as well; I'll try to publish a synopsis in the January 2024 newsletter (due out in mid-December 2023).

Been There, Done That

Tower Of London

In the October issue of Stamping Around, I talked about the "Underground", which is how Annie & I got around London during our Valentine's Day trip to London shortly after "Y2K" took effect.



One of the places that we visited, was of course the "Tower of London".

So what is this "Tower of London"? Part of it is shown on Great Britain Scott #831, which shows the "White Tower", after which the entire castle

grounds is named. Below is a photo I took of a model of



the Tower of London that was displayed during our visit there just 1 day prior to Valentine's Day. It shows the "White Tower" surrounded by a dual set of fortification walls.

The Tower of London was founded way back in 1066 as part of the Norman Conquest and was built by Norman the Conqueror in 1078 and was later (1100 to 1952) used a prison, although the main purpose of the

White Tower was that of a royal residence. The layout in the photo is essentially how it has looked since the late 13th century.

Today, the Tower of London is a favorite tourist site for many, where one can view the "Crown Jewels" and other items, which are kept in the "Jewel House". Note: the "Royal Stamp Collection" is kept at Buckingham Palace though.

As I've mentioned in other articles, I do enjoy visiting castles and fortresses when I'm traveling, and this is certainly one of the nicer ones! There are something like 4,000 castles in England, but supposedly Germany has over 20,000 castles. Go plan your trip now!

The stamp at top left was part of a souvenir sheet of 4 issued for the 1980 London International Stamp Exhibition.

The picture at lower left shows Annie in front of the tower, and she in turn took a photo of me in one of the guard booths (right).

Since this all took place over 23 years ago, my memory got a



rusty, so as usual, I had to consult Wikipedia for some basic info for this article. For further and more detailed info, dive into the link below:

Been There, Done That

Tower Bridge By Peter Elias

If you read the "Tower of London" article on the previous page, you can think of this article as a continuation of that.

When you are standing on the north bank of the Thames River, looking at the Tower of London castle complex and basically turn around, this is what you would see (well, generally without me in the way...):



Some people might say, "oh, that's the London Bridge". Nope, wrong. This is the "Tower Bridge", which is aptly named due to being, well, by the Tower of London...

However, there does seem to be an occasional confusion by some people about the name... Over the centuries, there have been several bridges named "London Bridge", and a more recent "New London Bridge" (built in 1831), which was sold and then dismantled in 1968 and moved to Arizona, brick by brick. This is shown on a British Honduras stamp (Scott #289, issued in 1971, which unfortunately I do not have a copy of). I'm sure that I saw the current London Bridge while I was there, I just didn't take a photo of it...







The current "London Bridge" is located about ½ mile west of the Tower Bridge.

The "PhotoStamp" and "Zazzle" stamp shown above used a picture of the Tower Bridge that I took at dusk on February 13, 2000 with my first digital camera, which had a whopping resolution of 1,280 x 960 pixels (= 1.3 megapixels) ;compare that to my current cell phone



camera whose sensor is 50 megapixels!

As far as "regular" postage stamps go, the Tower bridge has been featured on a few; most recently on Great Britain #2070 (above), part of a set of 5 stamps from 2022 featuring "Bridges of London". The only copy of the stamp I could find



was a used one on an envelope and I had to soak it off. Luckily the postmark isn't too heavy, since I try to avoid using used stamps as I want to focus on the design of the stamp, not the postmark.

Construction of the Tower Bridge began in 1886 and it was opened on June 30, 1894. Steel was used for the framework (such as the towers)

and then clad in granite & stone. There was a subway & pedestrian tunnel under the Thames River where people could also cross the river. Once the bridge was opened, much of the pedestrian traffic was via the bridge.

The bridge is approximately 800 feet long and the 2 towers are 213 feet high and 200 feet apart. There are 2 pedestrian walkways at the top (which can be accessed via stairs & elevators in the towers) and 2 street-level traffic spans at the bottom, which can each be raised by 86 degrees to allow taller ships to pass. The 2 towers each are supported by cables at the outside ends, making that part of the bridge a "suspension" bridge.

We did walk across the bridge, although I don't remember whether we saw the exhibits that they had.

Been There, Done That

Botanic Gardens By Peter Elias





Shown above and left are St. Vincent Scott #222, #223 and #1580. They all depict the

Botanic Gardens in Kingstown.

The gardens were founded in 1765 and are located on 20 acres of land. They are the oldest in the Western Hemisphere! Amongst the many tropical trees & shrubs is a breadfruit tree grown from the original plant brought by Captain Bligh (as of the "Bounty" fame) in 1793.

In addition to conservation work regarding plants, the gardens' work also involves the endangered St. Vincent parrot (featured on St. Vincent #282 at right - this one has the scarce "Mustique Island" printing in the margin).

In April 1993, after collecting St. Vincent stamps since about 1975, I was finally able to visit my favorite philatelic collecting area! One of the many places we visited was the Botanic Gardens in Kingstown (see photo above right). My photo includes the gazebo that is also prominently shown on the three stamps!



I don't remember seeing a St. Vincent Parrot on that visit, but when I returned in 2007, there was one at the hotel that we stayed at.

While I have visited the Ft. Worth Botanic Gardens, there's no stamp for them... Should

you ever find yourself in St. Vincent (which is now accessible by jet!), visit these gardens!




I've been to (or should I say "through") Barbados a couple of times, generally when having switch planes when flying to or from St. Vincent. Barbados is in the "Windward Islands", which also includes Dominica, Grenada, Martinique Saint Lucia and St. Vincent (plus the "Grenadines" islands between St. Vincent & Grenada). And while these are the main "southern" islands in the Caribbean, it does not include Trinidad & Tobago (although I have been to Trinidad - see articles in the May 1999, and June & September 2021 issues).

Barbados (see black arrow on St. Vincent #199 above) is about 118 miles east of St. Vincent. At the time of my April 1993 trip, the St. Vincent airport at Arnos Vale could not accommodate jet airline traffic (nor direct flights from Miami), so one had to take a jet to Barbados and then transfer to a "puddle jumper" (generally on LIAT or BWIA). I've had to do that in 1993 as well as 2007.

Ok, now that we've got the geography lesson out of the way ... From April 16-25, 1993, Nancy (my 1st wife) and I took a trip to Barbados for a couple of days (after which we flew to St. Vincent). We had a couple of days in Barbados, and stayed at the Sam Lord's Castle [Marriott] hotel for acouple of days (that was previously covered in the May 2018 issue on pages 3 & 5; as well as an article by Bob & Pat Weidman on page 7).

On our trip 1993, and while I can only tolerate so much



sun on the lovely beach at Sam Lord's Castle, we did go to the capitol city of Bridgetown.

On the picture at bottom left, you can see an "arch" over the road. That is "Independence Arch". That arch is also shown on Barbados #299, issued in 1967 for Barbados' 1-year Anniversary. My picture is even close to being taken from a similar viewpoint as on the stamp, but now that I'm looking at it a bit closer, I do see some differ-

ences in "design"!





On the stamp, there are two "tridents" (i.e.: a 3pronged spear) shown near the base of both sides of the arch. Compare that to my photo, where the tridents are at the very top on either side! In its place appears to be a fish (left side) and a bird (pelican?).

On the stamp, the base of the arch extends horizontally away from the arch on either side, but on my photo it doesn't. Did the stamp

designer take some liberties with the design?

Behind the arch, on both the photo and the stamp, is building i seen а which appears to be a church (but isn't) and has a distinctive very tower (see arrow on Barbados #237



above). It is the Parliament building & Museum. while I do have a picture of the building, space in this article doesn't allow for it.

Barbados was a British Colony since 1627, and on November 30, 1966, became a Commonwealth realm, followed by transitioning to a republic within the Commonwealth on November 30, 2021. As always, see Wikipedia for more info: https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Barbados.

While I didn't get any philatelic souvenirs on that trip, I

did end up with a nice "revenue document" when we left Barbados for St. Vincent. the required "Airport Departure Tax", or "service charge" as they call it here...

PS: I prefer mint stamps but could only find used ones ...

EXPO Planning Meeting - October 7, 2022

Call-To-Order:

- The meeting was called to order by Chairman Ralph Poore at 11:30 AM.
- The minutes were accepted as published in the newsletter.

General Chair:

- Ralph Poore made some announcements:
 - Silent Auction:
 - For visibility, a banner will be hung with the MCSC logo and "silent auction" on it. This will be a permanent banner for use every year. There will also be a temporary banner with for our club's 50thanniversary on it for this year.
 - Since the Silent Auction area will be at floor level this year, security for security for the tables near the stage required that the curtain be drawn to near the center. Silent Auction tables will be adjusted to fit this.
- Exhibits for next year:
 - At a prior meeting, Rich Hildebrandt had volunteered to head the exhibits for EXPO 2024.
 - We need to start working now on next year's exhibits.
 We need to get volunteers to elicit frame displays.
 - We also need people to help Rich with various exhibits & exhibiting-related tasks.
 - Mechanics of putting exhibit frames together.
 - Planning the Awards ceremony & dinner.
 - Forms and paperwork for exhibitors.
- Volunteers this year for helping the dealers with their setup.
- Cachet:
 - Office Depot and Office Max no longer do these covers.
 - Rick Howell has volunteered to print these; the EXPO has agreed to cover the cost of ink.

Deputy Chair:

 Stanley Christmas had no announcements but will be covering for Ralph from January to April next year.

Committee Chairs:

- <u>Beginning Collectors</u> Skip is continuing to sort through stamps for the MixPix, Silent Auction, Chance Board and Beginning Collectors tables.
- Bourse Tom Cunningham:
 - Thanked us for the work that has been done for the security of the dealers.
 - 25 tables have been sold and paid for, with two dealers being new to our show.
 - A question was brought up about the possibility of adding a virtual presence to our show. Tom felt exhibits might work but sales would be problematic. This will be thought about for the future.
- <u>Cachet</u> Rick Howell will print these.
- Chance Board Ralph explained for Patty Poore that the Chance table will use the same board but has made some changes to the way it works. Chances will \$1 or 6 for \$5.
 With the \$5 comes a special selection by available topic.
- Exhibits:
 - We should pick a 2024 theme soon. Come to the December meeting with some ideas. This will help us get exhibits for next year.

- Plan for fixing / replacing existing frames.
- Find someone to fix our frames.
- Replace frames with new ones.
- Find a show that is stopping and offer to buy them.
- <u>Finance</u> Judy Christmas said the budget is good. Table fees have been paid.
- Hospitality Janet Moyer is ready to print replaced name tags and all is good.
- <u>Judges</u> We need to start looking for judges for 2024.
- <u>Mail-out</u> Stanley Christmas will reprint the mail-out with corrections. The envelopes are addressed and stamped.
 325 envelopes and 550 e-mails will go out.
- <u>Mix-Pix</u> Bob Weidman has a good supply of stamps.
 The bags are ready to sell and will be at the Mix-Pix table and some at the Chance Board.
- Programs Stanley said the program this year will be 16 pages. 400 will be printed. He is ready except for a list of the sample exhibits in the frames that will be located just inside the main doors.
- <u>Publicity</u> We have already been listed in Linn's and posted at various other places.
- <u>Security</u> Security at night will be the Grapevine Police at \$50 an hour. [Note that we are required by the Convention Center to use GPD for overnight security.]
- <u>Silent Auction</u> Tom Turner announced there will be a meeting on October 17th to decide the auction lots and placement on the stage.
- <u>Signs (outdoors)</u> Ralph Poore said either he or Evan Islam will do the signs.
- Snacks are under control.
- Volunteers Janet Moyer announced that most slots are filled and we have several new members that are volunteering.
- Raffle:
 - We have three items to raffle. Tickets will be \$1 or 6 for \$5. The items will be on display at the registration desk.
 - A motion was made by Stanley to have the first drawn name get the Penny Black; the second drawn name will get the #C3 air mail stamps; and the third drawn name will get the framed lithograph with the Texas Duck Stamp. Rick Howell seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

Extra items:

- <u>Cabinets</u> We have two usable cabinets. The third cabinet will be discarded.
- <u>Dinner before the set-up</u> will be at Flip's on the feeder road of the 114 Freeway. We have the room from 3:00 to 4:00 PM on Thursday, November 9th. Dinner will be provided.
- <u>Lunches</u> lunch orders are being taken and will be ordered before the EXPO. Donna Howell and Kathryn Storey will help with this.

Next Meeting:

 Our next meeting will be the post-show "debrief" meeting for this year and the planning meeting to start next year.

Texas Archery Stamp

It is not often that I get to write about Texasrelated stamps, but I did find a nifty "Texas Archery Stamp" from 1980 that was still attached to the original State of Texas "Hunting & Fishing license".

The first image below is of the back of the license, which has the Archery stamp on it, but also a blank spot for another stamp, such as a "white-winged dove stamp", "Archery stamp" or "Federal Migratory Bird Hunting Stamp" on the left side. But wait, isn't that the Archery Stamp on the right side? After shining a flashlight on the back of this license, I could see that the text box behind the Archer Stamp has exactly the same text as on the left side.


Interestingly enough, there are 7 "tags" as part of this license: for turkeys, bucks or antlerless deer or buck mule deer. None were apparently used. This license is printed on what appears to be TyvekTM material, and thus is waterproof, which would come in handy if attaching these tags to an animal.

The tags are removable as they have rouletting, allowing for easier removal while in the field (unless you have scissors on you).

While the State Revenue Society's "State Revenue Catalog" lists all sorts of revenue stamps for Texas, apparently "hunting license" related stamps are not part of these listings. If there is a catalog out there that lists these type of stamps, unfortunately I don't have it...

Never-the-less, this is a nice document for collectors of revenue, fiscal, tax and/or license stamps! It's always best to leave stamps like this on their original document. Much more history is preserved that way!

 Before the auction, Dave had the drawing for three \$10 MCSC gift certificates.


Auction:

USPS Handy Hints

By Peter Elias

The USPS has a handy "Quick Guide" for various items, one of which is "Non-Denominated Postage". This is a 5-page (depending on your print settings) guide that shows all recent (and back to the 1970's) non-denominated US postage stamps along with their actual "face value" if you wish to use them as postage, check it out here: https://pe.usps.com/text/qsg300/Q604a.htm.

I recommend that you print it out so you have it handy if needed when preparing items for mailing using these stamps (and in turn you might have to prove it to the local post office clerk...).

When mailing items, keep in mind that it is now not just weight and distance, but also "shape" (i.e.: length, height and width). With 1st class mail, you also need to factor in "stiffness". I frequently mail a 6x9" envelopes that are only 2 or 3 ounces in weight, and for which I use a cardboard stiffener and it is still less than ¼" (~6 mm) thick. The USPS clerks are then very quick about telling me that it now HAS to go as "Ground Advantage" [GA, and previously known as "1st Class Parcel"). I tell them NO, it does not (and go check their own rules). A 6x9" envelope that is 1 to 3.5 ounces, is less than ¼" thick and has a stiffener is STILL considered a 1st Class Letter rate item. The rules state that if it meets all the other requirements of a 1st



Class Letter, but is "stiff" (i.e.: not easily bendable for the corner of a counter), then you simply have to pay the extra "non-machinable surcharge", which is presently $40 \, c$. So a 2-ounce item with stiffener is $90 \, c$ postage + $40 \, c$ non-machinable surcharge = \$1.30. That is certainly way less expensive that paying \$4.75+ if this is mailed as Ground Advantage.

On the other hand, 1st Class Letter mail is NOT insured and not tracked, and if that is what is needed, then yes, I do recommend that mail this item via Ground Advantage, as that now provides free tracking AND up to \$100 insurance! And all of that still costs less than a Flat-Rate Priority Mail [PM] envelope (which is also tracked and has up to \$100 insurance), it's just that GA is about a day or three slower than PM. Size requirements are here: https://pe.usps.com/text/dmm100/mailing-domestic.htm.
