The main reason for limited programming is that the Triennial, which will be held in Louisville, Kentucky the last week of June, will consume much of our budget and energy, so at this point, we will focus on our

one required meeting.

A major requirement of the Annual Meeting is to elect a President. While I do plan to run for another term, we are open to any other candidate who feels called to lead us. The job requirements are as follows per the bylaws:

All officers and board members must be communicants in good standing and resident in the Diocese of Chicago.

A. A nominee for the office of ECW-Chicago President shall have served a previous term of at least six months as a member of the Board and shall have relevant management experience in business or another non-profit organization.

Here is a bit more detail about duties from our Policies and Procedures:

### **President:**

- Sets meeting agendas, calls and facilitates all meetings of the Board;
- Appoints members and ex officio members of the Board of Directors with concurrence of the other officers;
- Creates and appoints committees to execute the programs and projects of the ECW-Chicago
- Represents Women's Ministries within the Diocese of Chicago, Province V and ECW Triennial.
- Serves as an ex officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee;
- Serves as a delegate to the Province V Annual Meeting and the Triennial Meeting of the Episcopal Church Women with expenses reimbursed by ECW-Chicago;\

- Furnishes any information requested by the ECW Province V, or the National Board of the Episcopal Church Women;
- Serves as ex-officio member of the Board of Trustees for the Episcopal Charities and Community Services.
- Is an authorized check signatory.
- Qualification: One year's previous experience on an ECW diocesan board.

It should be noted that one of the first official duties of the newly elected President will be to lead the ECW-Chicago delegation to the Triennial being held in Louisville, Kentucky in June 2024.


