All trustees were in post for the whole 2021/22 reporting period. No other charity trustees operated during this period.

Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

Constitution determining how the charity shall be run as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Charity trusteeship is open to any individual aged 16 or over who supports the organisation's aims (providing eligibility requirements stipulated in paragraph 20 of the constitution are also met. Applications are considered by the board of trustees. The constitution determines nine trustees as the maximum size of the board.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

- The advancement of environmental protection and improvement in Ghana, through the awarding of funds to conservation organisations and projects.
- The advancement of citizenship and community development for local people in Ghana through the awarding of funds to organisations and projects.
- The advancement of education in the wildlife and ecology of Ghana through the promotion of conservation projects and the benefits they provide.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

People and Wildlife Ghana raises awareness of the importance of community-based conservation work in Ghana, develop partnerships and fundraises (through applying for grants and soliciting donations) to support local organisations in Ghana. These partners undertake excellent sustainable development work in Ghana – helping local people whilst conserving wildlife and enhancing the environment.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The first significant event of the financial year was the receipt of £1,000 from Sydney E Franklin Deceased's New Second Charity, which was banked in April on behalf of the Kalakpa Club. This support enabled the Kalakpa Club to train three local craftsmen in building beehives and beehive stands, whilst 27 people in the Club's coffee growing training programme were supported to assist with planting of 6,000 coffee bushes. However, disaster has struck the area through particularly bad dry season fires, which have destroyed most of the bee hives and many of the young planted coffee bushes.

The Club considers that they are seeing the impacts of a changing climate. With bush fires a growing problem for people, their houses and farms, the Club is now planning more awareness training in mitigation measures such as the creation of fire breaks. Despite this adversity, the Club is increasing its activity, having found new volunteers, and increasing their liaison with the Ghana Government Wildlife Division who manage the Kalakpa Resource Reserve. A Club initiative resulted in the West African Primate Conservation Action charity surveying the reserve, ensuring up-to-date information on aspects of the important wildlife interest of the site.

PAW Ghana also received a significant corporate support grant (US \$5,000) from the Jacobs organisation, to fund the installation of a borehole and the construction of a block-built store building at the Kalakpa Club's eco-centre. This infrastructure will allow the eco-centre to undertake a wider range of training events and activities. The borehole will allow a tree nursery on site, and demonstration of drip irrigation farming techniques. The building immediately offers improved on-site security, which can be enhanced further if it also allows a night-watchman to be housed on site. The project also increases the eco-centre's resilience to bush fires.

Save Ghana Frogs also benefitted from a grant from PAW Ghana to enable them to respond to very worrying deforestation events at Sui River Forest Reserve (the only site in the world with recent records for the Giant Squeaker Frog, a Critically Endangered species). Save Ghana Frogs used the funding to consult with community leaders and to speak to local and national politicians. The key result of the grant support was making the case for a much-needed Key Biodiversity Area designation to be afforded to the Sui River Forest Reserve.
