ALL HORSES MUST BE FULLY VACCINATED. Horses must have 7 clear days since their last vaccination before arrival at the showground. PASSPORTS WILL BE CHECKED ON ARRIVAL.

#### CLASSES 1 – 9 OPEN TO MAIN / ANNEXE & PART BRED REGISTERED HORSES, ANY AGE/SEX

**Class 1 – Ultra novice/nervous handler** – Horse/handler combination not to have won any in hand showing class. Aimed at true novices/nervous handlers.

Class 2 – Best condition

Class 3 – Sports horse type

Class 4 – Riding horse type

Class 5 – Hunter type

Class 6 – Most Colourful Leopard

Class 7 – Most Colourful Blanket

Class 8 – Most Colourful Other (this includes solids)



#### MOST COLOURFUL CHAMPIONSHIP (1<sup>ST</sup> & 2<sup>ND</sup> FROM CLASSES 6/7/8)

Class 9 – Veteran 15 years and over

(1st & 2<sup>nd</sup> from the veteran class go forward to the relevant main reg or part bred championships)

#### IN HAND MAIN REG/ANNEXE CLASSES - Not before 10.30am

Class 10 – Yearling fillies, colts, geldings Class 11 – 2 & 3 Year old Fillies Class 12 – 2 & 3 year old Geldings Class 14 – 2 & 3 year old Colts Class 15 – Mares 4 years and over (cannot enter class 17a) Class 16 – Geldings 4 years and over Class 17 (a) – Broodmares (to have foaled or be in foal for 2024) Class 17 (b) – Foals. Must be born in 2024 and be 4 weeks or over – Mares & foals in the ring together but will be judged separately. Class 18 – BApS Licensed Stallions

#### IN HAND PART BRED CLASSES - Not before 10.30AM

Class 19 – Part bred youngstock, yearling to 3 years. Geldings and Fillies. Class 20 – Part bred Mares 4 years and over (cannot enter class 22a) Class 21 – Geldings 4 years and over

Class 22 (a) - Part bred broodmares (to have foaled or be in foal for 2024)

Class 22 (b) – Part bred foals. Must be born in 2024 and be 4 weeks or over – Mares & foals in the ring together but will be judged separately.

#### CHAMPIONSHIPS IN RING 1 FOLLOWING IN HAND CLASSES

#### MAIN REGISTERED YOUNGSTOCK CHAMPIONSHIPS

Highest placed males & females from classes 10, 11,12, 14 & 17b MAIN REGISTERED MALE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> placed males from classes 9, 10, 12, 14, 16, 17b & 18

#### MAIN REGISTERD FEMALE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> placed females from classes 9, 10, 11, 15, 17a, & 17b PART BRED MALE CHAMPIONSHIP

1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> placed males from classes 9, 19, 21, & 22b PART BRED FEMALE CHAMPIONSHIP

1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> placed females from classes 9, 19, 20, 22a & 22b

#### SUPREME INHAND CHAMPIONSHIP

Champion & reserve from youngstock, male, female, part bred male & part bred female to come forward.

#### **RING ONE FOLLOWING THE SUPREME CHAMPIONSHIPS.**

Class 23a – Young handler 11 years and under

Class 23b – Young handler 12 – 16 years

Open to any breed of horse/pony. Exhibitors will enter the ring at the same time but be judged in 2 sections. Please note that the handler will be judged not the horse/pony.

#### RIDDEN CLASSES RING 1 - NOT BEFORE 1PM.

#### (ALL HORSES TO BE 4 YEARS AND OVER)

**Class 24 – Concours d'Elegance** – All forms of costume permitted, ridden side saddle, astride or western. Judged on the overall picture. Lead rein permitted; young riders may enter on ponies.

**Class 25 – Ultra Novice** – walk & trot only. Horse/rider combination not to have won any ridden showing classes. Aimed at true novices/nervous riders. SNAFFLE BRIDLE ONLY, NO SPURS but NECK STRAPS ALLOWED. (Main reg/annexe and part bred)

Class 26 – Novice ridden – Main reg/annexe

Class 27 – Novice ridden – Part bred

Class 28 – Veterans – 15 years and over (Main reg/annexe and part bred)

Class 29 - Ridden Horse (Main reg/annexe and part bred)

Class 30 – Open ridden horse (Main reg/annexe)

Class 31 – Open ridden horse (Part bred)

Class 32 – Riding Club Horse (to include a 2'3" fence) - Main reg/annexe and part bred.

#### **RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIPS**

 $1^{st}$  &  $2^{nd}$  from classes 26 – 32

#### SHOW RULES

- ALL entry fees must be fully paid up by entries closing date, otherwise your entry will not be valid.
- NON-ATTENDANCE In the event you do not attend the show for whatever reason, we will not
  offer a refund of any entry fees. However, if you supply us wit a letter from either a Veterinary
  surgeon or a Doctor, indicating a genuine reason for non-attendance due to injury or any condition
  that precludes you attending, then we will be happy to roll over your entries to the next Society
  breed show (but be aware the would not cover any additional price increases applied the following
  year if that were the case and any transfer of fees would not include stabling or fees already paid
  to the original venue, that cannot be retrieved)
- Persons are admitted to the showground at their own risk. The organisers will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to spectators, horses, riders or any other person and ant loss damage cost and expenses, however caused.
- <u>The judge's and organisers decisions are final.</u>
- The organisers reserve the right to cancel, combine, add or amend ant class and cannot be held responsible for any losses incurred.
- Riding hats/Beaglers/Bowler hats/Top hats A correctly fitted chin strapped hat must be worn by all exhibitors under 18 whilst mounted. A British Standard Riding Hat is STRONGLY recommended for ALL in hand classes. Also, must be worn by ALL young Handler classes & in hand competitors that are under 18. Persons choosing to not wear a hard hat MUST sign the official disclaimer, with respect to headgear, prior to participating in any classes. We advise all persons to wear strapped hats.
- The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to the showground to any horse they do not consider suitable, to safeguard the public and other competitors against accident.
- Ownership All horses (except those taking part in classes 23a, 23b & 24) must be owned by a current member of BApS.
- Young handlers must be current members of the society.
- Horses/ponies being handled in classes 23a & 23b (Young handler) may be of any breed, age, sex or size. The Handler, not the animal, will be judged.
- Exhibits may be shown hogged, plaited or natural. Tails plaited or natural as best suits the animal.
- All foals must be led in hand, with their dams or alone. Foals must be born in the year of the show.
- Stallions/colts must be shown bitted from TWO years old. Entire horses are the responsibility of the owner or handler.
- Welfare Any, misbehaviour or abuse of horses, judges, stewards or organisers, their representatives, grooms or handlers, will result in that person being requested to leave the showground immediately, without the return of entry fees etc.
- All animals must be sound.
- Horses competing in ridden classes must be 4 years and over.
- Registration- All foals must be registered, and the necessary forms and payment received by the registrar at the closing date for show entries. All other animals (except those taking part in classes 23a/b & 24) must be registered with BApS. No animals with "pending" registrations will be accepted
- All entries on the day must be accompanied by the correct identification or registration papers (Passports)
- Objections Any objections must be made in writing to the Show Secretary with a deposit of £30 which will be refunded if complaint is upheld.
- Refunds No entry fee will be refunded unless a Veterinary Certificate is presented.
- Trimming of whiskers/sensory hairs is not permitted
- Only clear hoof varnish/oil is permitted
- No earrings/body piercings are permitted in the ring. This a Health & Safety requirement.
