




Our Spring Show was our first “live” event of the year (we held a photo show in February to help raise funds for our nominated charities) and although numbers were down, great fun was had by all attending. We had some last minute adjustments to do, due to not being able to use indoor schools anymore, even with restricted numbers forward, but we duly swapped to the outside ring at Willow Farm in Kent and kicked off the season with our Foreign Breed specific Spring Show.

It was great to see many new faces (and horses) attending, and this event was certainly the time for the novice horses to have their chance to gain some ring experience. Rui Campeo was our judge for the event, and he gave feedback in the classes which we saw put to use during the course of the day.

We had a selection of pure and part foreign breeds present – Saddlebreds, Quarter Horses, Miniatures, Haflingers, Friesians, Arabs, Appaloosas, Warmbloods, Standardbreds, Selle Francias, PREs & Lusitanos – so everything from 32” up to over 17hh.

We included a “Best Body Score” award, which was judged by veterinarian surgeon Diana Stark, who came in the morning to assess all the in hand horses on the showground. After careful consideration, the award was presented to Pete Saunder’s PRE Fer Bravo.

We had British Appaloosa Society “Award of Merit” cards, which were presented for both the in hand and the ridden section to Alyce Clark’s Bullies Bandita.

Our veteran classes were affiliated the the VHS and were Gold Ticket classes for the VHS Supreme Finals in October. The in hand Golden Ticket went to Virginia Draper and her PRE-Fusion Diamanté Del Rey and the ridden ticket went to Jamie Rashbrook’s Westfalen Garden Farm MoJo.

All our in hand and ridden foreign breed classes were qualifiers for the APHS Foreign Breed National Finals, which is being held on 12th September and cards were presented in the ring to all class winners. All winners are then eligible to go forward to their respective Foreign Breed National Finals, being held on 12th September at the APHS Autumn Show. All APHS foreign breed classes are qualifiers, as are foreign breed classes at selected shows across the country (details can be found on our website).

The In Hand Championships saw the young PRE stallion Fer Bravo take championship spot in the purebred section for Pete Saunders with Zoe Kershaw’s Arabian Jayden’s Leandro taking the reserve spot. Virginia Draper’s veteran PRE-Fusion Diamanté Del Rey took the partbred championship and Courtney Clarke’s Partbred Arab, Erimus Royal Affair, took the reserve spot.

As the first of our 5 championships during the day, the in hand championships saw our first few winners of our own JRL Champion of Champions Golden Tickets being presented. These will be presented to every APHS Champion and Reserve at all our 2021 events, which enables them to come forward to the JRL Champion of Champions which is being held on 12th September at our Autumn Show.

After a short lunch break the youth and novice classes followed which are open to any breed of horse and pony, which had their own championships. Youngest rider at the event, Charlie Brailsford, made his debut at the APHS events in the Youth Walk/Trot class and according to his mother he managed his best rising trot to date, which everyone was very happy about. He left the ring with his winning rosette, sash and goodie bag with a keepsake trophy.

Our open walk/trot class was the biggest class of the day – a great opportunity to get young and/or inexperience both riders and or horses alike into the ring. Our Novice Champion was Pete Saunders' Friesian Tjomme W with Michelle Alford's coloured traditional Cameron taking the reserve spot.

In the ridden championships again we split it into pure and partbreds. Hillary McNeil's Lusitano, Jazz took the purebred championship, with Jamie Rashbrook's Warmblood, Garden Farm Mojo, taking the reserve spot. For the partbred section we saw Alyce Clark's Appaloosa Bullies Bandita taking the top spot. Our in hand and ridden championships were pinned down to 6th place and garlands were presented to all our 5 champions at the show.

New for this year, APHS held a Foreign Breed Solstice Show on 27th June at White Horse Farm in Kent. Last year this event was held at the end of October, but by moving it to June we were able to take advantage of additional parking in the field. There were just under 50 horses in attendance, a great turnout for a specialist event.

We had a huge selection of foreign breeds ... Well done everyone again - Arabs, Morgans, PREs, Lusitanos, PRMe's, Gelderlanders, Friesians, Miniatures, Warmbloods, Standardbreds, Selle Francais. Horses from foals that were 3 months old to veterans that were 30.

A big thank you to our hosts White Horse Farm, our judge Richard Chamberlin, our ring steward Manda King, our photographer Lotte Simons and of course to all our sponsors and competitors. Every show says it, and it's completely true for all of us, without generous sponsors many events would not be able to run. Our sponsors for this event included Debbie Bell's Creature Comforts, GBPRE, USA-UK, Virginia Draper, JRL Stud, Amanda Birch Dressage and KC Saddlebreds. With blinged sashes for all sponsored class winners we also had a bottle of wine on offer too.

In Hand classes were in the morning and comprised of breed specific, type and sex classes, culminating in a purebred and a partbred Foreign Breed In Hand Championship. Wowing the judge and audience alike was the 3 month old PRE filly foal "Portia", bred on site at White Horse Farm, who went on to win the Youngstock class. With so many classes on offer we saw lots of winners, who all then went forward for their respective championship. The purebred in hand championship went to the PRE Hispanico, owned by Emma Nuttall and shown by Steve Merchant. Taking top spot in the partbred in hand championship was Courtney Clarke's veteran PBA mare, Erimus Royal Affair.

We had a Best Body score award which was presented during the morning, in the in hand section, and we are pleased to say it went to Catherine Greening and her Morgan mare, Welland Crystal. Well done Catherine. (There is also a Best Body Score Award being presented at the [APHS London Counties Horse Show](#) (18 July), as well as our Golden Rosette Award). This was judged against a perfect 5/10 body score of the horse, together with the overall health and turnout.

Midday classes comprised of Junior, Novice and Fun classes, which were open to any breed not just Foreign Breeds. The youth class was won by Melissa Mountford on Norman (who was later shown in the bus pass class by Melissa's mum, heralding her first return to the show ring in 3 years). The golden oldies "Bus Pass" class followed – open to horses and riders who had a combined age of 60 years or over, which was won by Emma Nuttall on Barocco, turned out immaculately in their traditional Spanish attire. The ridden novice class was won by Jodannah Davis on Rushton Bali Empress and then this class was followed by the "fun" Champagne Class. Don't let the word "fun" fool you, there was some serious competition going on in this class, as everyone was determined not to spill any of their wine! The two junior competitors in this class, Annabelle Thomson and Hannah Beckett, went on to stand 1st and 2nd only losing 15mm and 18mm of wine respectively. As the prize for first and second in this class was a bottle of bubbly and they were both juniors, we gave their prizes to their parents.

The Foreign Breed Ridden classes then followed, again with a selection of breed, type and sex classes. We saw a combination of English and Traditional turnouts (Spanish and Portuguese), which made for a colourful and enjoyable ringside viewing.

Our AOTS class (amateur owned, trained and shown) is judged 50% on manners – our in hand winner was Rosie Hobbs and Alondo and the ridden winner was Victoria Perry and Karioco De Amtuna.

As with the in hand section, with so many classes offered we saw a number of class winners in the ridden – again all of these winners went forward to either the pure or partbred ridden championship. After much deliberation, Emma Nuttall's PRE Hispanico was named the champion Purebred. Emma also won the partbred ridden championship with "Check It Out", who was shown by Steve Merchant.

It is safe to say that everyone had a great day and the best part was we were able to raise £600 for our two nominated charities – Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning (TEAL) and Dogs On The Streets UK (DOTS).

Now one of our competitors deserves a mention all of their own – Ashley Davis' Gentleman Jack.

Ashley found Jack abandoned in County Part in Kent on 28th September 2019. He had an old rug tied tightly on him, to cover up what was underneath. Not sure what to do, Ashley contacted a local animal sanctuary for help. Over the course of the next four days, Ashley was able to get a 4-Day notice from the council to secure on the fence, giving the owners the opportunity to come forward. Twice daily Ashley would visit Jack to feed him mash and hay and make sure he had water. On day 3 he started to deteriorate, so Ashley contacted Bell Equine who advised her to bring him in as soon as possible.

Another charity, "Sweeps Fund", run by Kate Morris at Bluebarn, arranged for a horse box to collect Jack the next day and when he was collected Kate told Ashley that the Sweeps Fund would cover Jack's first week of vet bills as well. Bell Equine were amazing and Jack travelled so well and was so forgiving and acted like a true gentleman – hence is name of "Gentleman Jack".

Once at Bell the room became very busy, with vets and at least six assistants – when his rug was cut off the toom fell silent. What we saw was unimaginable – he had a body score of 0. He had open wounds on his legs and thick shoes on his feet, that had been poorly nailed on and his hooves sliced around the shoes.

Jack had been used in a trotting race and trotted non-stop for hours, he was truly exhausted. After an examination that took well over an hour, Jack was placed in a stable where he collapsed in a heap and started to eat the shavings, he was so hungry. Jack spent ten nights at Bell Equine and the first few were very much touch and go as he could not stand up unaided. Thankfully he started to brighten up and managed to graze happily in a paddock. After day ten he was cleared to come home to me.

The time Ashley has had Jack has been fraught with ups and downs, with moments of pure joy and some of complete despair on my part. Jack has been a challenge, but together with Ashley they have grown together and bonded so much. Jack will stay with Ashley forever, through good and bad, as Ashley does not want him to ever go through what he did again. Because of his breed (Standardbred) Jack will always be seen as a trotter/pacer to some, to be put in a scully, which Ashley says will never happen again.

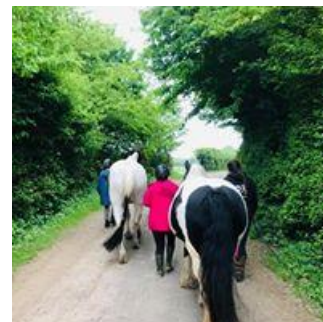
Ashley has taken everything slowly with him and as Jack is now 4, with the all clear Ashley has gently backed him and says he is so honest that you can't help but love him and his cheeky ways. Ashley has put her all unto Jack and Jack has given his all back.



TEAL (Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning) CIC was started in 2015 with the aim of providing a therapeutic setting in which horses help our clients overcome problems they are facing in their everyday lives.

This involves specially selected and trained horses and specialist staff, highly experienced in various special educational needs, particularly in autism. Lucy is qualified and trained in therapeutic equine assisted learning, counselling, mental health awareness, health and social care level 3, and first aid. TEAL staff have over 30 combined experience working with children with SEN needs, and over 22 years working with horses, using natural horsemanship techniques.

This is all delivered in a natural, non-clinical environment. TEAL is based in a beautiful countryside location in Kent. Being in natural environment's has been scientifically proven to improve people's well-being. TEAL deliver therapeutic assistance to a wide range of people, such as difficulties with traditional schooling, special educational needs, poor literacy & numeracy skills, learning difficulties, behavioural difficulties, communication and speech, change established behaviour patterns, learn new skills, confidence building, reducing anxiety, fine & Gross motor skills, concentration, relaxation, Increase self-confidence, Raise self esteem, Improve communication skills, Seek a different approach in dealing with depression, people in care homes with Huntington's, dementia and other associated disorders.



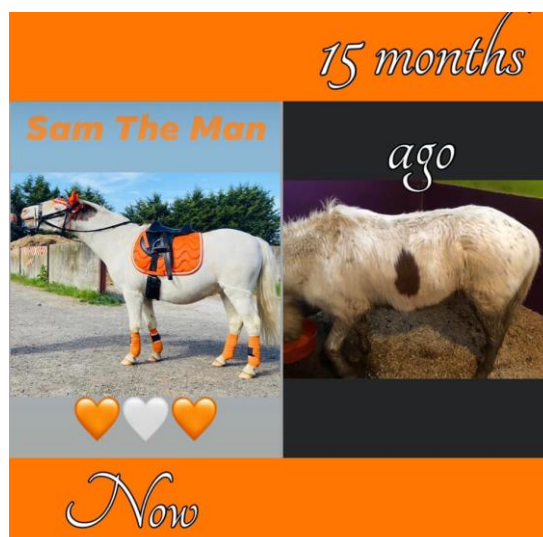
All our horses are wheelchair trained so we can lead from wheelchairs around the beautiful farm and still be groomed and painted even to those with restricted movement.

In 2017 we wrote our first educational course “basic stable care and horse management” the course is tailored to our students needs with lots of practical work and over learning of skills, we also run a level 2 “Grooms course” that gives all the students the skills needed to get into work in the equine industry and offer our students volunteering roles with us on completion of the course. For some of our students this will be the only qualification they will gain upon leaving education, for others this will be the only form of education they receive due to failed placements, we are currently looking to write a level 3 course.

TEAL horses are highly trained to work with our clients, 2 of our horses are rescues and our most recent rescue was SAM THE MAN in early 2019, Sam was a starvation case and has fitted into our herd really well and is a firm favourite with many of our younger clients.

A few weeks ago Sam began to work with a 5 year old who has autism and is/ was non-verbal.

During the first session as always we began grooming to affirm the friendship the clients build with the horses, the young boy was a little unsure and had a very short attention span, on our first walk out he refused to hold the lead rope and was more interested in jumping in the puddles during our walk, fast forward 5 weeks and now he leads Sam around the farm, over trotting poles in the sand school and we are all greeted verbally including the



ever so sweet sound of “ I love you Sam”, in a very short space of time the amazing power of horses has given this young boy his voice, a love for Sam and better attention to the task at hand.

Another of our students came to us for 2 weeks work experience in 2015 with the only knowledge of horses to be a few RDA lessons, she has been with us ever since, Molly has completed both of our courses, has worked on 2 other livery yards, still comes to us twice a week to volunteer.

Here is a testimonial from some of our residents at a care home we work with, our horses have also visited the home and gone into the rooms of those that are bed bound.

A typical time spent with TEAL.....

As we drive around the corner we can hear Ben neighing his greeting. The residents then get excited knowing that they have arrived. The residents all have huge smiles, knowing that Pudding is going to come out and say hello, if the weather is nice they enjoy taking her for a walk in the country, all being the ones that can lead her first. Then it is time to go back to the stables for grooming and painting Jigsaw, she is so good that sometimes she likes to rest her head on Marys neck to sleep! All the while Ben is trying to see around the corner and wondering why we haven't been to say hello yet. Soon it is time to go into the stables to have a scratch and a cuddle with Breeze and Ben, before we sadly have to leave. All of the residents of Birling house are excited and the horses are a calming influence on the residents who all enjoy talking to the horses, grooming and petting them, all of the horses are so gentle even the mighty Big Ben, who just wants a scratch of the nose! They enjoy giving them carrots and Mary enjoyed going for a ride when Jigsaw pulled her along in her wheelchair, laughing so hard that she didn't want to let go of the carrot.

It is so refreshing and makes our job worthwhile seeing Lucy and Lisa and the horses interacting with the residents, catching up and cuddling the horses we just do not want to leave and look forward to the next visit. It is an amazing place to visit for the residents, the staff, the horses and Lucy and Lisa who do an amazing job. This is not just a place to visit, TEAL is a place for the residents to visit their friends, because that is what Lucy, Lisa and the horses have become our favourite friends.

Over that last 2 years the money that has been raised by APHS shows has helped a number of our clients in providing full or part sessions and also funding part courses, without funding such as this TEAL could not be able to help as many clients as we do, from all of us at TEAL we would like to say a massive thank-you for your support.



APHS LONDON COUNTIES SHOW 2021

Held on 18th July at Patchesham EC in Surrey, this is our biggest show of the year.

What an amazing day we all had at the 2021 APHS London Counties Horse Show. Of course we picked the hottest day of the year so far, but that didn't stop over 160 horses taking part and raising an amazing £1,000 for our nominated charities. Longtime supporter Pat Fewster with Bascote Percival won the ridden coloured native & traditional class and Dot Anderson with Cameron took the honours in the Traditional Gypsy Cob Ridden class as well as the Ridden Veteran class.

Presiding over our Foreign Breed ring, Natalie Hudson had travelled down from South Yorkshire to officiate the classes. The APHS Foreign Breed National Finals is open to qualified horses only, who have qualified during the past year (both at APHS events and other shows holding APHS affiliated foreign breed classes). The Partbred Foreign Breed National Champion was Manda King's Cruzados, Lots Of Love. Usually standing on the other side of the ring stewarding, this was Manda's first time showing "Ludo", as he is known at home. Manda had only imported Ludo a few months earlier from Portugal, so what a debut to the show ring. Reserve in the Partbred Foreign Breeds National Championships was Asher Carr's Trelawyns Jack. In the Ridden Foreign Breed section we saw an amazing range of breeds, some showing in English tack and some in their Traditional tack. Our Open Breed In Hand Champion was Michael Innes' Highland stallion, Lionsor Talisman, having earned his spot in this championship by taking a second place in the Mountain & Moorland In hand (large breeds section). Our Open Breed In Hand Reserve Champion was Ruth Baker and Tilton Ice, who came through to the championships with a win in the popular Veteran In Hand class.

During the morning Ruth Franklin from Sound Equine very kindly judged The Horse Trust & University of Liverpool Healthiest Body Score Awards. These were presented to the following horses, all scoring 5/10 on their body scores:

Our Young Horse classes were very popular, with Julie John's Roe Ayham taking the top spot in the Open In Hand class; Emma Stares and Hawksworth Crystal Rose taking the Open Ridden Class and Sherene Rahmatallah and Lirico taking the Foreign Breed ridden class in this division.

Longtime supporter Pat Fewster with Bascote Percival won the ridden coloured native & traditional class and Dot Anderson with Cameron took the honours in the Traditional Gypsy Cob Ridden class as well as the Ridden Veteran class.

Our Concours classes, as usual, were well supported and we saw Rebecca Turner on her Lusitano Garibaldi D'Atela taking the Ridden section, bedecked in their traditional Portuguese outfit and Virginia Draper, with her PRE-Fusion, Diamante Del Rey taking the in hand section – this time with a Spanish themed outfit. Rebecca & Garibaldi also won the Parade class and stood 2nd in the Ridden Iberian & Baroque class and the Ridden Foreign Breed Purebred Gelding class (one of the largest classes of the day). This pair then went on to stand Reserve Supreme Champion 2021 in the Foreign Breed Purebred Ridden National Finals.

Alex Coe and her Welsh C, Corstan Valero (our supreme ridden champion from the London Counties Show in July) returned to the Autumn Show to stand at the top of the line in the Ridden Mountain & Moorland class and also take the Open Breed Ridden Championship. Bettina Tunnell with Chase Colet, also had a successful day winning the Partbred Mountain & Moorland Ridden class, the Riding Club Horse class, the Ridden Sports Horse class and then the pair stood Reserve in the Open Breed Ridden Championship.

A big shout out to all our junior exhibitors and young horses at this show. Scarlett-Rae Stocker on the Dartmoor, Southernstone Finest Rose, won her lead line class, took the Junior Ridden Championship and then went on to stand Reserve Supreme Champion in our JRL Champion of Champions at the end of the show – our youngest competitor forward for these championships. Our JRL Champion of Champions is for all our champions and reserves at all APHS events throughout the year and we saw 19 horses and ponies come back for this championship. We had 3 junior exhibitors in the top 6 of the JRL Champion of Champions 2021 (an amazing achievement) – Scarlett-Rae Stocker (who took Reserve), Preston Johnstone (who took 5th place and was one of only two in hand horses placed in this championships) and Alex Coe (who took 6th place). Young Horse The Longhouse Little Star, owned by Teresa Kinglsey and shown by Helen Richards, came 2nd in the Novice class and won the Ridden USA Breeds Partbred class. Another young horse, a Friesian mare "Silke Fan De Lege Geaen" owned by Sally McIntyre and shown under saddle by Krystal Shawyer, won the Foreign Breed Snaffle Bit class and the Foreign Breeds Ridden Purebred Mares class, as well as standing 4th in the APHS Foreign Breeds Purebred Ridden National Finals.

Presiding over our Foreign Breed ring, Natalie Hudson had travelled down from South Yorkshire to officiate the classes. The APHS Foreign Breed National Finals is open to qualified horses only, who have qualified during the past year (both at APHS events and other shows holding APHS affiliated foreign breed classes). Our classes on the day were judged by Natalie, but we had invited judge, Susan Cave to preside over the Foreign Breed In Hand Championships. We saw many breeds present and many new competitors, as well as lots of regulars.

So, in the "Battle of the Breeds" which breed won? For the In hand section, we would have to say the Arabians probably pipped the other breeds to the post, taking the Foreign Breed Purebred Mature class (Cara McKinnon's Red House Romeo), the Foreign Breed Youngstock class (Zoe Kershaw's Jayden's Leandro in the pure section and Debbie Bell's Moorfarm China Doll in the partbred section). Our Foreign Breed Purebred In Hand National Champion was Zoe Kerhsaw's Jayden's Leandro & Reserve was Mandy O'Nion's PRE, Federal YAF. The Partbred Foreign Breed

National Champion was Manda King's Pb Lusitano, Lots Of Love. Usually standing on the other side of the ring stewarding, this was Manda's first time showing "Ludo", as he is known at home. Manda had only imported Ludo a few months earlier from Portugal, so what a debut to the show ring. Reserve in the Partbred Foreign Breeds National Championships was Asher Carr's Trelawyns Jack.

In the Ridden Foreign Breed section we saw an amazing range of breeds, some showing in English tack and some in their Traditional tack. Catherine Greening with her Morgan Mare, Welland Crystal, had a successful weekend having won the Beechwood TREC Pairs class the day before and then taking Second Reserve Champion in our APHS Foreign Breeds Purebred In Hand National Finals, a first in the Ridden USA Breeds and a 5th in the Ridden Foreign Breeds AOTS class. Cara McKinnon's veteran Arab, Red House Romeo, also had a great day winning the Ridden Foreign Breeds AOTS class, the Ridden Arab class and taking Second Reserve in the APHS Foreign Breed Purebred Ridden National Finals.

Having qualified at our Spring Show in May another Friesian, Tjomme W (owned by Sonny Hillier and shown by Pete Saunders) also had a great day. As his "day job" is working in harness, his achievements were even more outstanding. Tjomme was shown to a successful win in the very strong Ridden Iberian & Baroque class, stood Foreign Breed Purebred Ridden National Champion and then took the JRL Champion of Champions Supreme Champion title for 2021 being crowned the "best of the best" unanimously by all our judges.

A big thank you to everyone that has supported the PHS events during 2021 – our judges, stewards and helpers, our sponsors and all our competitors. All of the APHS events help to raise funds for charity and we donate at least 50% of all event profits to our nominated charities, which group members help to select. This year we were able to donate an amazing £2,920 to Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning, Dogs On The Streets UK and Dogstar Foundation.

Congratulations to Virginia Draper and Diamante Del Rey on winning this shows Golden Rosette, selected by Connor Jarvis pictured right with the winning pair. This award is for who Connor thought was having the most fun on the showground.

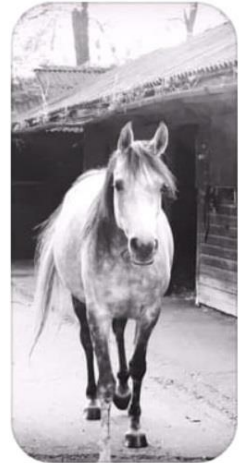

Dutch Day – (April 2021) for all our Dutch horse/pony owners. This was won by Nicky Gee's Friesian

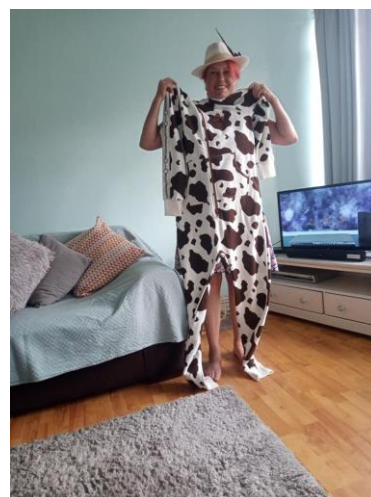

APHS AUTUMN SHOW 2022

(September 2022)

This will be held at Patchesham EC in Surrey on the second Sunday in September (11th) and will have 4 showing rings – 3 on grass and one on rubber. It will also incorporate our APHS Foreign Breed National Finals as it has done in the past. In 2021 we made this our “bling” show, with championship size rosettes for all class winners. Did you like this? We think you did, so we will be continuing with this tradition for 2022. We are also introducing a NEW Veteran Championship for 2022, open to all 1st & 2nd in all our veteran classes throughout the year. Our JRL Champion of Champions will now have even more prizes, as this includes what was our Supreme Championships in July. Confirmed judges so far include Heather Linfield (M&M and TGCA classes, ring 1), Andries Domburg (Netherlands) (foreign breed classes) & Hendriline Hertzog (Netherlands) (Foreign Breed National Finals & our new Youth Finals and Veteran Finalé).

Due to requests we are also looking at the possibility of running a SW Foreign Breed Show (in or near Devon). At the moment this is not confirmed, but the likely date would be 31st July 2022. Stay tuned and follow our Group and website for more updates.

NEW CHAMPIONSHIPS FOR 2022:

- **VETERAN FINALÉ – kindly sponsored by Garden Farm Stables**
- **JUNIOR RIDDEN SUPREME – kindly sponsored by Stephanie Fitt**

Each of these two championships will be open to the top two from their respective classes at APHS throughout 2022. (Top 2 in all the youth/junior riders classes for the Junior Championship and the top 2 from all our veteran classes for the Veteran Finalé). APHS FOREIGN BREEDS SHOWING & NATIONAL FINALS

The Foreign Breed Finals will be held within our September Show as normal.

So, how do you qualify for the National Finals?

You can qualify at any APHS event in one of our Foreign Breed classes – all winners qualify. If you win an in hand class, then you qualify for the in hand finals and if you win a ridden class then you qualify for the ridden finals. We will have 4 National Finals in 2022 again – a pure and partbred section both in hand and ridden. For 2022 we will be offering prizes to all the Foreign Breed National Champions & Reserves and pinning to 6th place too. In addition, we will add to this list as we get sponsors and donations of prizes.

We will be having one judge to officiate over the foreign breed classes at this show (they are all open, so no qualification needed – in fact they will be your last chance to qualify for the Foreign Breed National Finals) and a totally different judge to officiate over the Finals themselves – so hopefully this will encourage you all to take part in the classes on offer as well. Both these two judges are from the Netherlands, so they will be totally new faces for you to show under.

Other shows can also affiliate and be eligible for their class winners or champions to be eligible to come forward for our National Finals. So, if you know of shows holding Foreign Breed classes, Championships or breed specific shows (Arab Shows, PRE shows etc.) why not contact them and get them to get in touch or check out our website to find out more details: www.aphs.org.uk

So, how do you qualify for the National Finals?

You can qualify at any APHS event in one of our Foreign Breed classes – all winners qualify. If you win an in hand class, then you qualify for the in hand finals and if you win a ridden class then you qualify for the ridden finals. We will have 4 National Finals in 2022 – a pure and partbred section both in hand and ridden.

JRL CHAMPION of CHAMPIONS

This was a new championship for us in 2021 and was the brainchild of and sponsored by JRL Stud. ALL our champions and reserves, from all the APHS 2021 events qualified for the “JRL Champion of Champions”, which was held at the end of the day at our Autumn Show. We pinned to 6th place, had a beautiful gold and green (JRL Stud colours) for the winner together with a prize of £100. We decided to match this and also offer £60 for the Reserve and £40 for the Second Reserve, as well as offering a bespoke show rug for the Overall Champion of Champions.

For 2022, we will not be holding our Supremes at the July Show, instead they will be incorporated within the JRL Champion of Champions in September. This will enable us to offer more prizes and awards in our end of year finale.
