APHS FOREIGN BREEDS FESTIVAL SPRING SHOW 2022 "Northern Counties"

This took place on Sunday 1st May. After requests for over a year to hold an APHS event in the northern part of the country, we finally did so – relocating our regular Spring Show from Kent to Lancashire.

Armed (via the internet and recommendations) with about 8 likely venues, the next step was to contact them all for availability.

Northcote Stud in Blackburn ended up as our destination and I must say the reality of the venue far exceeded their actual virtual representation. The outside arena was HUGE! (And that was only our warm-up and collecting area). Entering through a rubber matted light and airy tunnel into the indoor main ring, exhibitors were greeted with a flag bedecked ring to showcase their horses. With a comfortable glass-fronted café at one end of the arena and additional seating at the other end, viewers had ample room to watch the classes unfold. Leading off from the indoor arena was another smaller ring which we used for our dressage classes and holding ring during the day when we had some slight drizzle.

We must say a big thank you to our sponsors at this show – it is always welcome and does make a difference between new ventures getting off the ground or not, helping to keep shows ongoing from year to year and of course allows us to give generous awards and prizes, which is always appreciated by the competitors. I would also like to say a MASSIVE thank you to everyone that chipped in and helped during the day – many, many people helped out, some who had only come to watch the event – it was very much appreciated.

For those of you who were wondering why I have been so hesitant to host a “northern” event – it was a 3-day event for myself, with a day either side spent travelling; two nights’ accommodation and fuel for the 500+ mile round trip will always mean this event was going to cost more to run than its “southern” counterparts. **BUT**, our Northern supporters did us proud – we had an amazing 56 horses pre-entered and even with a couple of horses withdrawing on the day this still meant we saw a 5% higher turnout than the show’s southern contemporary. We were also able to make a small donation (£220) to our two nominated charities as well (TEAL & DOTS). Needless to say we will be back in Lancashire for 2023 (30th April)!

We must also thank our judges and stewards at the show – Chris Porter, Lynn Stainton, Jane Weatherell, Estelle Macdiarmid, Val Draper, Virginia Draper, Nancy Tew & Trevor Fryatt.

With 54 horses on the showground we saw a wide range of breeds forward and all of a great standard – Arabian, Saddlebred, Morgan Horse, American Miniature, Falabella, Ardennes, Fjord, Haflinger, PRE, Lusitano, Gelderlander x, Dutch Warmblood, Standardbred, Mustang, Percheron x to name but a few of the wonderful foreign breeds present.



So many horses stood out, it’s hard not to mention them all. One of our youngest competitors, **Rachel May Hunt**, with her PBA “**Miss Petal**” had a great day. Virginia Draper, a regular competitor at our southern events, undertook the four hour long journey with her PRE Fusion “**Diamanté Del Rey**” and was rewarded with wins in all her classes and the Partbred In Hand Championship (see photo right).

We had our much liked “**Best Body Score**” award, which was judged among the mornings in hand horses. We only had one award, and this went to **Yarrow Chia Bendle’s Lusitano Gelding Lusiasdas**. For next year we will be running this award over a 2 hour time frame during which horses can be presented for scoring, and any horse scoring 5/10 will receive a Body Score rosette. This will be free for any APHS Northern Counties Spring Show (2023) competitor, foreign or open breed and has kindly agreed to be judged by Oak Hill Equine Vets.

Alicia Houlihan and her Haflinger mare “**Tina**” also had a great day, doing well in all her classes and culminated with the Reserve Champion title in the Purebred In Hand Championships (see photo right).

We had British Appaloosa Society “Award of Merit” cards, which were presented for BAPs members in the in hand and ridden USA Breed classes as well as Appaloosa Horse Club UK rosettes, which were presented to any Appaloosa forward in the same classes (no membership required).

We had a block of open breed classes too (open to any breed, not just foreign breeds), which included youth ridden, open ridden, champagne, concours d’elegance and dressage classes.

Our concours classes were well supported and we pinned the open into different categories – in hand, youth, traditional/heritage turnout, hand made and open. We also introduced a new class for concours to the showing world – Style and Performance. Although this type of class has been seen for many years in prix caprilli and jumping classes, this is the first time it had been applied to a concours d’elegance class and it was very well received. 50% of the marks were awarded for the competitors



on performing a set pattern, with the other 50% being given to the overall impression of their turnout, how well it matched the horse and how it “rode”.

We will always try to add classes (time and scheduling permitting) where there is a need – either borrowing classes or divisions from other countries, like our Academy Junior Junction classes that we hold at our London Counties show or visualising totally new classes. The Academy division is

borrowed from the American showing scene and is aimed at those new to riding. Especially with junior riders, who grow so quickly, or may not be so enthusiastic after a season or two, this division allows riders to show without a full attire – they just need to be smart and be wearing a safety hat and suitable heeled boots – a shirt and tie and school jumper is totally acceptable to wear. Over the years we have added new classes to the showing scene – Limit class (where the rider/horse combination is not to have won more than 6 firsts), Intermediate Canter (a progression class for those transitioning from walk/trot classes to open classes) and the Concours Style & Performance class. We always know we have a “winner” when these classes start to appear in other show schedules in the country.

Our champagne class is always a fun class and this proved no exception at this show, with many juniors also joining in the fun (they had a glass of water to compete with, unlike the adults who were given wine). It was in fact one of the junior riders, **Chloe Dinsdale**, who took the honours in this class, and although we could not present the alcoholic prize to Chloe, she was quick to mention that her mother would love to have the prize instead.

As always, our ridden classes make up the last section of our days show. Our Foreign Breed ridden classes allow for any (correct) showing tack, so you can easily find saddle seat, western, traditional Spanish or Portuguese and English (hunter) styles in any one class.

Again, we had many stunning horses forward and their various styles of tack and turnout drew many an appreciative comment from the viewing public.



Our Purebred Ridden Champion was **Georgina Smith**, with her Dutch Warmblood mare “**Doberlina**”. (see photo above, courtesy Majestic Photography). Back in 2019 when we first instigated the Foreign Breed National Finals, Georgina travelled all the way down to Surrey to take part and was crowned our very first Foreign Breed National Champion. In 2019 there was only one championship with in hand and ridden, pure and part all in together (we have now progressed to four separate National

Finals), so it was an impressive win for Doberlina to stand champion over all the horses forward. It was great to be able to see the pair compete on “home turf” and to take the championship as well.

All our in hand and ridden foreign breed classes were qualifiers for the APHS Foreign Breed National Finals, which is being held on 11th September and cards were presented in the ring to all class winners. All winners are then eligible to go forward to their respective Foreign Breed National Finals.

Needless to say we will be holding the event again in 2023 – it will be the same weekend (30th April 2023), so book the date in your diaries now and keep an eye on our Facebook group (APHS London Counties) and our website (www.aphs.org.uk) for updates and news. We hope you will all join us next year, old and new competitors alike, for our APHS Northern Counties Spring Show.

As we appreciate it is a huge distance for our northern based competitors to travel down to Surrey for the Foreign Breed National Finals each Autumn (although we would love to have you), we hope to grow this Spring Show into its own version of a Northern Championship event for foreign breeds. To make this possible we welcome sponsors for the 2023 event – we already have some signed up with prizes on offer (see below some of the blinged rosettes that we are offering for all classes sponsored before the end of Feb 2023, that have gifts/prizes on offer). APHS FOREIGN BREEDS FESTIVAL SOLSTICE SHOW 2022

This is the third year we have held a dedicated foreign breed show at this venue, and the support for it continues to grow year on year. As always there is an open breed section in the middle, for juniors, young and novice horses and fun classes, which are open to any breed not just foreign breeds. All APHS shows are fundraisers for our two nominated charities, Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning and Dogs On The Streets (UK) and this year was no exception.

As with any show, we are forever grateful to our sponsors, judges and helpers, without whom no show would be able to run. We would like to thank all our sponsors – Equine Manual Therapist, Lusitano Breed Society of Great Britain, JRL Stud, Emergosol Lusitanos, Horse Show Garlands and Debbie Bell's Creature Comforts; our judge Mrs Britt Evans, who travelled from Colchester and our helpers and stewards including Julia Valentine and Mr Evans.

With 60 horses taking part this represented our largest Solstice Show and we had a range of Foreign Breeds in attendance, both pure and partbred. It was great to see so many in the Iberian/Baroque classes, especially the many that dressed in full traditional attire. Our classes are open to all, so English dress is perfectly acceptable and in our open breed classes, as these are aimed at novice and youths, we allow academy attire as well as the aim of this section (well all our events really) is to encourage people to take part and join in the fun, not be put off by having to purchase full show attire first. We also run all-inclusive shows, which means everyone goes home with a rosette regardless of where they placed (or didn't) in a class – this means that there are a lot of smiling faces all round.

We had a strong youngstock class – again this is encouraging to see and it will be great to see how all these babies develop over the years, every one of them was stunning. No one horse dominated the show, each class was judged according to the merits of the actual class and how the horses performed within that class, so we saw a real mix of horses taking top spot in each class.

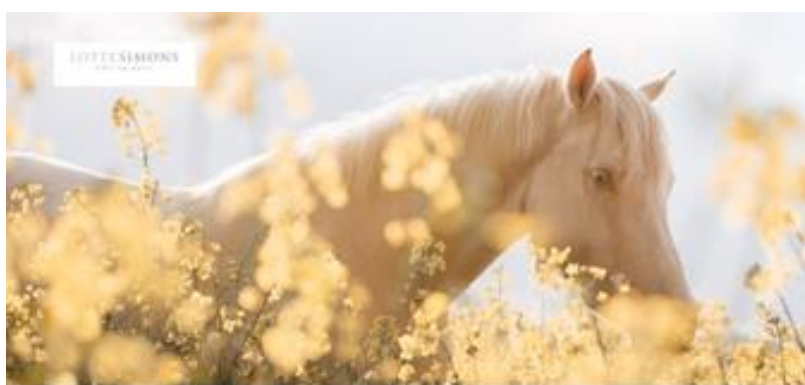
When it came to the in hand championship, in the purebred section White Horse Farm Team wiped the board, with Emma Nuttall's horses taking the top three available spots – Encendido in champion place, Ringo in Reserve and Hispanico in Second Reserve. We also present amateur awards in all our championships, which allows our amateur competitors to be placed and also to go forward for our Champion of Champion finals in September. In the purebred section this was presented to Helen Francis' Comtois, Gasper De L'Heute. The Partbred In Hand Championship was won by Michelle Snelling's Gables Oast Arabian Knights – a stunning 3 year old Partbred Arab – I for one am looking forward to seeing this chap out under saddle in the next year or two.

Our Ridden Youth class was very well supported, with 12 pre-entries, so this was split into two sections to give the younger ones their own group. Our Champagne Class is always popular – the Juniors seemed to do better in this class than their older counterparts. New for this year was our bareback dollar class – with the winner taking the money pot. This was won by Sue Gates and her Pb Appaloosa Annaghmore Ambiton. By request this section of open breed classes will be expanded slightly next year and they will also have their own championships too.

After lunch were the ridden foreign breed classes. Some of these were breed specific and some type specific (lightweight, Amateur rider etc). It was great to see so many ridden horses taking part and also to see the progression of some of our 2020 and 2021 horses and riders this year. Like the in hand section, as there is such a range of classes on offer no one horse dominates the ridden section, so when it's time for the ridden championships it really is anyone's game and all to ride for. Emma Nuttall had three horses through to this and had team member Stephen Merchant ride one of her stallion's Encendido. Really showing the boy off, especially in the extended trot section, Steve pulled

the championship out of the bag with his ride on Encendido. Reserve (& Amateur spot) was Helen Francis' Comtois gelding, Gasper De L'Heute and in Second Reserve spot was Jessica Perry's stunning Friesian Dolf Van De Heide. In the Partbred Championship top spot went to Manda King's Partbred Lusitano gelding, Lots of Love. Manda has been a stalwart steward for us for over a decade, so it is great to see her on the other side of the ring and doing so well too is just icing on the cake. In the Reserve spot we saw another partbred Iberian, Christiano, ridden by Annabelle Thompson and Alyce Clark's partbred Appaloosa, Bullies Bandita, took Second Reserve.

We look forward to returning to White Horse Farm next year – our 2023 Solstice Show will be on 25th June 2023, so hopefully we will see you all there as well.

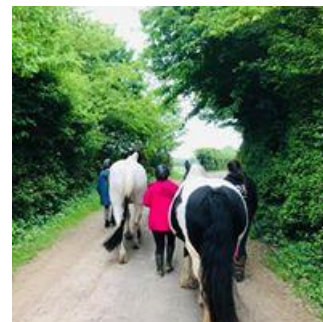


All our champions and reserves from this show have qualified for our JRL Champion of Champions and all winners of the Foreign Breed classes have qualified for the APHS Foreign Breed National Finals.

TEAL (Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning) CIC was started in 2015 with the aim of providing a therapeutic setting in which horses help our clients overcome problems they are facing in their everyday lives.

This involves specially selected and trained horses and specialist staff, highly experienced in various special educational needs, particularly in autism. Lucy is qualified and trained in therapeutic equine assisted learning, counselling, mental health awareness, health and social care level 3, and first aid. TEAL staff have over 30 combined experience working with children with SEN needs, and over 22 years working with horses, using natural horsemanship techniques.

This is all delivered in a natural, non-clinical environment. TEAL is based in a beautiful countryside location in Kent. Being in natural environment's has been scientifically proven to improve people's well-being. TEAL deliver therapeutic assistance to a wide range of people, such as difficulties with traditional schooling, special educational needs, poor literacy & numeracy skills, learning difficulties, behavioural difficulties, communication and speech, change established behaviour patterns, learn new skills, confidence building, reducing anxiety, fine & Gross motor skills, concentration, relaxation, Increase self-confidence, Raise self esteem, Improve communication skills, Seek a different approach in dealing with depression, people in care homes with Huntington's, dementia and other associated disorders.



All our horses are wheelchair trained so we can lead from wheelchairs around the beautiful farm and still be groomed and painted even to those with restricted movement.

In 2017 we wrote our first educational course “basic stable care and horse management” the course is tailored to our students needs with lots of practical work and over learning of skills, we also run a level 2 “Grooms course” that gives all the students the skills needed to get into work in the equine industry and offer our students volunteering roles with us on completion of the course. For some of our students this will be the only qualification they will gain upon leaving education, for others this will be the only form of education they receive due to failed placements, we are currently looking to write a level 3 course.

TEAL horses are highly trained to work with our clients, 2 of our horses are rescues and our most recent rescue was SAM THE MAN in early 2019, Sam was a starvation case and has fitted into our herd really well and is a firm favourite with many of our younger clients.

A few weeks ago Sam began to work with a 5 year old who has autism and is/ was non-verbal.

During the first session as always we began grooming to affirm the friendship the clients build with the horses, the young boy was a little unsure and had a very short attention span, on our first walk out he refused to hold the lead rope and was more interested in jumping in the puddles during our walk, fast forward 5 weeks and now he leads Sam around the farm, over trotting poles in the sand school and we are all greeted verbally including the



ever so sweet sound of “ I love you Sam”, in a very short space of time the amazing power of horses has given this young boy his voice, a love for Sam and better attention to the task at hand.

Another of our students came to us for 2 weeks work experience in 2015 with the only knowledge of horses to be a few RDA lessons, she has been with us ever since, Molly has completed both of our courses, has worked on 2 other livery yards, still comes to us twice a week to volunteer.

Here is a testimonial from some of our residents at a care home we work with, our horses have also visited the home and gone into the rooms of those that are bed bound.

The residents of Birling House, enjoy attending TEAL!
A typical time spent with TEAL.....

As we drive around the corner we can hear Ben neighing his greeting. The residents then get excited knowing that they have arrived. The residents all have huge smiles, knowing that Pudding is going to come out and say hello, if the weather is nice they enjoy taking her for a walk in the country, all being the ones that can lead her first. Then it is time to go back to the stables for grooming and painting Jigsaw, she is so good that sometimes she likes to rest her head on Marys neck to sleep! All the while Ben is trying to see around the corner and wondering why we haven't been to say hello yet. Soon it is time to go into the stables to have a scratch and a cuddle with Breeze and Ben, before we sadly have to leave. All of the residents of Birling house are excited and the horses are a calming influence on the residents who all enjoy talking to the horses, grooming and petting them, all of the horses are so gentle even the mighty Big Ben, who just wants a scratch of the nose! They enjoy giving them carrots and Mary enjoyed going for a ride when Jigsaw pulled her along in her wheelchair, laughing so hard that she didn't want to let go of the carrot.

It is so refreshing and makes our job worthwhile seeing Lucy and Lisa and the horses interacting with the residents, catching up and cuddling the horses we just do not want to leave and look forward to the next visit. It is an amazing place to visit for the residents, the staff, the horses and Lucy and Lisa who do an amazing job. This is not just a place to visit, TEAL is a place for the residents to visit their friends, because that is what Lucy, Lisa and the horses have become our favourite friends.

Over that last 2 years the money that has been raised by APHS shows has helped a number of our clients in providing full or part sessions and also funding part courses, without funding such as this TEAL could not be able to help as many clients as we do, from all of us at TEAL we would like to say a massive thank-you for your support.



APHS LONDON COUNTIES SHOW 2022

Celebrating our 35th anniversary show, headed into the event (like many others) I was glued to the weather warnings and the Met Office Weather site. Having looked back over previous years, the scheduled temperature was actually due to be lower than at past shows, so we made the decision to go ahead (expected temperature was 29 degrees – in 2020 the temperature was 31 degrees and in 2019 it was 30 degrees). As the weather is usually hot for this show, we already had in place many caveats to ensure everyone's safety. Water is on site for horses, exhibitors are allowed to compete without jackets and for the ridden classes the judges were only asking for short individual shows and no go-rounds – this enabled everyone to stay in the shade between their classes and not be out in the sun. We also allowed anyone who wanted to switch from afternoon to morning classes or to switch horses (some decided they didn't want to bring their older/younger horses) without penalty. Understandably some decided to withdraw as their main concern was having to travel on the dreaded M25, but we had over 100 showing on the day. As it transpired there was a very stiff breeze all day (even lifting gazebos in the lorry park), which did much to keep everyone cool and Sound Equine Veterinary Practice, who were in attendance during the day, did not see any horses in distress.

Our traditional and native horses were out in force, as were our Foreign Breeds, making some of the biggest classes of the day. One of the favourite championships of the day is our Youngstock Championship, and this year was no exception. Jo Martin's tradition Wyestone Heartbreaker had a great day taking the Open In Hand Native/Traditional Championship, the TGCA In Hand Championship and then the Youngstock Championship. Taking the Reserve spot was the AMHA Miniature, Suzie Grey's BMS Another Hershey Grand Prestige, who also won the Miniature Championship and the Foreign Breed In Hand Championship too. Our Second Reserve in the Youngstock Championship was Amanda Truss' Partbred Arab yearling filly, CS Destiny, who also stood Reserve in the Foreign Breed In Hand Championship. Our Native/Traditional In Hand Reserve was Chartside Jezebel shown by Tainee Morgan for Sue Gates. Sue was competing with her partbred Appaloosa, Annaghmore Ambition and she gained her VHS Area Ticket in the Ridden Veteran class. Sue kindly lent the ride on her horse to young Isabella Abbott, who won the Best Rider 8 years and under class and then went on to stand Second Reserve in the Junior Ridden Championships. Our Ridden Native/Traditional Champion was Alex Coe with her Welsh Sec C, Corstan Valero – returning to the show to take this championship for the second year running.

Thank you for a lovely show today, first time coming to you will def be back for others.

Although fewer in numbers, the quality of our non-native/plaited horses and ponies forward was very high. Natasha Anglin's show pony, Barkway Huckleberry stood in hand champion in this division, with Debbie Bell's youngstock, Moorfarm China Doll taking Reserve spot. Debbie was especially pleased as she also gained a Horse Trust Best Body Score Award – again a repeat from winning one in 2021. In the Ridden Non-Native/Plaited Championships it was Victoria Strutton's Sound Barrier that took the Championship title, as well as the Reserve in the Ridden Multi-Colour Championship. Our side saddle rider, Kathryn Pedrick on Fool of A Took, took Reserve place in the Non-Native/Plaited Ridden Championship.

Our Junior Riders did exceptionally well. Charlotte Dunford with Eeabrook Dante took the Junior Championships and Sienna White with Pennington Prince Rainer took Reserve spot. Sienna also took Reserve in the Ridden Native/Traditional Championships and the Championship spot in the Multi-Colour Ridden Championships.

We saw a range of breeds forward for the foreign breed ring. Sky Joya a PRE (Purebred Spanish Horse), ridden by James Smith, won the Foreign Breed Ridden Championship, Roe Ayham an Arab, owned by Julie Johns took the Reserve spot and the Morgan Horse Welland Crystal, owned by Catherine Greening took Second Reserve.

With over 60 classes offered and 10 championships, I think it is fair to say the most coveted awards were the Horse Trust's Best Body Condition rosettes and our own APHS Fit not Fat Awards. We've been awarding these in some fashion since 2018 and at the 2022 APHS London Counties we awarded 16 of these awards. Sound Equine Veterinary Practice was in attendance to score the horses and they commented on how much the message seems to be getting across into the showing world and complimented everyone as they also saw many 6's (6/10 body chart score) who were almost at the perfect weight too.

A big thank you to all our sponsors, judges, stewards and helpers at the APHS London Counties Show 2022. We were able to present prizes for over 50% of the class winners, and although our numbers were down on previous years due to the weather, we were still able to donate £700 to our nominated charities, Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning and Dogs On The Streets UK.

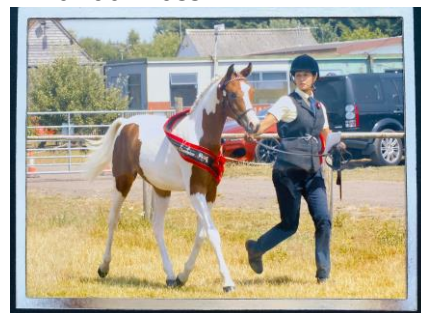

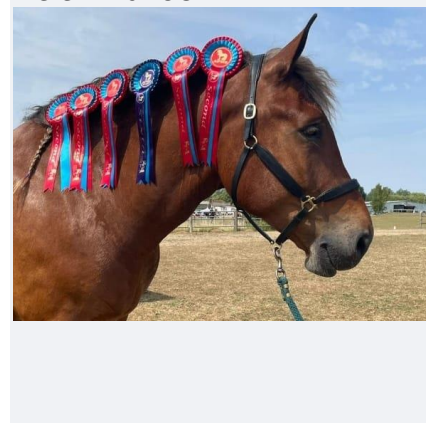

This was the final show of 2022 for the APHS show series and saw over 100 horses taking part. It hosted the APHS end of year Finals – the Veteran Finale, the Junior Ridden Finals, the Foreign Breed National Finals and the APHS Champion of Champions. All of these finals (bar the Champion of Champions) had a completely different judge than the rest of the show and we were honoured to have Hendriline Hertzog from the Netherlands presiding over these. We had a second international judge, Andires Domburg, judging the Foreign Breed ring, who joined Stephanie Fitt, Leigh Wilson, Heather Lindfield, Vera Huddleston and Alex Franks as our line up of judges. Like many shows, in respect to the sad passing of HM the Queen, we held a 2 minute silence at midday as a mark of respect.

In the “English” classes it was certainly the Welsh that dominated the in hand section. One of the youngest entries on the day, the 2022 filly Welsh Gracelands I Got Lucky, shown by Tainee Morgan, won the Mountain & Moorland Large In Hand class, stood second in the Foals & Yearlings class and then Reserve in the Native, Cob & Traditional Championship. Sandy Garlic's Welsh B, Cosford Liberty, won the Mountain & Moorland Small In Hand class, came second in the Home Produced 14.2hh & under In Hand class and then took the Native, Cob & Traditional In Hand Championship, as well as winning the inaugural APHS & Horse Trust Best Body Score Championship. Another Welsh B, Thistledown Blue Diamond shown by Jamie Rashbrook, won the Home produced 14.2hh & under class and then took the Second Reserve spot in the Native, Cob & Traditional In Hand Championship – making the top 3 spots in this championship all going to Welsh Cobs & Ponies.

Youngster CS Destiny, owned by Amanda Truss, had a successful day winning both the Foals & Yearlings class and the Coloured Non-Native In Hand class and went on to stand Second Reserve in the Non-Native In Hand Championship and Reserve in the Foreign Breed Partbred In Hand National Finals. Winning the Non-Native In Hand Championship was Debbie Bell's Moorfarm China Doll, who also won the 2 & 3 Year Old class and the Foreign Breed Partbred Youngstock class. Samantha Jones' Sulan Top Gun won the Non-Native In Hand Championship, having also won the Home Produced over 14.2hh In Hand class, the Partbred Arab In Hand class and the Foreign Breed Partbred Mature class. This combination also took the 2022 Foreign Breed Partbred In hand National Finals.

In the veteran classes, Victoria Strutton's Sound Barrier won both their In Hand and Ridden age classes and then stood Reserve Champion in the Veteran Finale. Taking the Veteran Finale Championship was Linda McGuire's 15 year old George Baker, shown by Jamie Rashbrook, who also went on to stand Reserve Champion in the APHS & Horse Trust Best Body Score Championships.

Julie John's Arab, Roe Ayham, won the In Hand Purebred Arab class for the second year running and then stood Reserve in the Foreign Breed Purebred In Hand National Finals. Gwen Sheldon's American Shetland Paintbox Twilight Zone, shown by Image Man, won their breed class (AMHA & ASPC), the Purebred Foreign Breed Mature In Hand class and then took top spot in the Foreign Breed Purebred In Hand National Finals.

The "English" ridden classes and championships were dominated by our junior riders. Sienna White and Pennington Prince Rainer took the Champion title in the Native, Cob & Traditional Ridden Championships as well as the honours in the Junior Ridden Finals, having also won the Ridden Home Produced and the Ridden Coloured Native, Cob & Traditional classes. Youth rider Charlotte Dunford and Eabrook Dante won the Ridden Show Pony/Show Hunter Pony class and then won Non-Native Ridden Championship and was also the winner of the title of "Amateur Champion" in our Champion of Champions. The Cullingham family also had a good show, with Lola on Menai Swing Along winning the First Ridden class and then on "Brian" winning the Open Walk/Trot class.

Always well supported our Concours D'Elegance was split into two sections – Virginia Draper on Diamante Del Rey won the adult section and Oliver Uttridge on Oliver's Theo won the Junior section. This year we held SEND classes (Special Educational Needs & Disabilities), which was won by Tiffany Heath & Hermit's Smokey Quartz, who is owned by TEAL (Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning) who are one of our nominated charities. These classes were sponsored by Firecracker Miniature Horses, and to encourage entries we kept the entry fees for these classes at a nominal price of £5.

There were a whole host of breeds represented in the Foreign Breed section, both in hand and ridden. In the ridden, Sky Joya, shown by Emma Thomas for Helen Lynch, won two of their classes and then stood Second Reserve in the Foreign Breed Purebred Ridden National Finals. Laura Leredde's PRE, Tango Gal, won three of their Foreign Breed classes and took the Champion spot in the Foreign Breed Purebred Ridden National Finals. The Foreign Breed Partbred Ridden National Finals was won for the second year by Sue Gates with her Appaloosa veteran gelding, Annaghmore Ambition. Our furthest travelling competitor Marie Jellyman with her Arab "Cynbad" travelled up from Devon and had a great time at their first APHS event. They took second spot in the In Hand Arab class, won the Foreign Breed Amateur Owned, Trained & Shown In Hand class, came second in the ridden version of this class, second in the Ridden Purebred Arab class and then Fourth in the Foreign Breed Purebred Ridden National Finals and Fifth in the Champion of Champions. Winning the Haflinger In Hand Award was Steph Jones and Simba and the Ridden Award went to Joanne Trivedi and Schieferstein Myissa – both of these Awards were sponsored by "Haflinger Friends". The PRMe Award, sponsored by PRMe UK Caballos de Pure Raza Menorquina, was won by Claire Sheerer's Zaida. Founder Nancy Tew & her husband Trevor, travelled down from Yorkshire to present this award.

We were also pleased to welcome Amanda Birch Dressage to Music, who hosted an introduction to Performance to Music and Dressage to Music. As well as a demonstration, people were also able to “have a go” and receive instruction, assistance with their music selection and feedback, as well as a participation rosette. This proved very popular and we will be repeating this in 2023.

At the end of the day was the APHS Champion of Champions, open to horses and ponies who had qualified throughout 2022. There were an impressive number of horses forward for this, including many in hand exhibits who had stayed on till the end of the day. All 5 judges presided over this championship and after inspecting all entries forward, Laura Leredde & Tango Gal were crowned our 2022 Champion of Champions. This was a wonderful result for Laura, as this was her last UK show, as she is shortly emigrating to Spain. The in hand non-native pony, Barkway Huckleberry, owned by Natasha Anglin and shown by David Strutton were pulled in Reserve Champion and the ASPC Paintbox Twilight Zone was crowned Second Reserve.

In all, £800 of prize money and over £500 of prizes were awarded at this show and we were also able to donate £900 to our nominated charities (Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning and Dogs On The Streets UK), bringing our total donated to charity for 2022 to just over £2,000. A big thank you to everyone that has supported the APHS shows this year, all our judges and stewards, our sponsors, and of course our competitors.

It will incorporate our APHS Foreign Breed National Finals as it has done in the past. In 2021 we made this our "bling" show, with championship size rosettes for all class winners. We also have our Veteran Finale Championship, open to all 1st & 2nd in all our veteran classes throughout the year; our Junior Ridden Finals (open to 1st & 2nd from all our Junior ridden classes throughout the year) and our Champion of Champions, for all champions, reserves, second reserves and amateur champions during the year. Plus we will be continuing with our innovative Horse Trust Best Body Condition Championship at this event in 2022, so hang on to all your Horse Trust and APHS Fit not Fat rosettes next year, as you will need them to take part.

END OF SEASON CHAMPIONSHIPS FOR 2023:

- **VETERAN FINALE**
- **JUNIOR RIDDEN SUPREME**

Both of these two championships will be open to the top 3 from their respective classes at APHS throughout 2023.

- **AMATEUR OWNED, TRAINED & SHOWN**

EVERY Championship in 2023 (except Junior Championships) will have an award for the highest placed Amateur Owned, Trained and Shown (AOTS) exhibitor. (To be considered, you must wear a white armband in your championships) – winners will receive a championship award and a qualifying card. So, how do you qualify for the National Finals?

You can qualify at any APHS event in one of our Foreign Breed classes – all winners qualify. If you win an in hand class, then you qualify for the in hand finals and if you win a ridden class then you qualify for the ridden finals. We will have 4 National Finals in 2022 again – a pure and partbred section both in hand and ridden. For 2023 we will be offering prizes to all the Foreign Breed National Champions & Reserves and pinning to 6th place too. In addition, we will add to this list as we get sponsors and donations of prizes.

We will be having one judge to officiate over the foreign breed classes at this show (they are all open, so no qualification needed – in fact they will be your last chance to qualify for the Foreign Breed National Finals) and a totally different judge to officiate over the Finals themselves – so hopefully this will encourage you all to take part in the classes on offer as well. Both these two judges are from the Netherlands, so they will be totally new faces for you to show under.

Other shows can also affiliate and be eligible for their class winners or champions to be eligible to come forward for our National Finals. So, if you know of shows holding Foreign Breed classes, Championships or breed specific shows (Arab Shows, PRE shows etc.) why not contact them and get them to get in touch or check out our website to find out more details: www.aphs.org.uk

So, how do you qualify for the National Finals?

You can qualify at any APHS event in one of our Foreign Breed classes – all winners qualify. If you win an in hand class, then you qualify for the in hand finals and if you win a ridden class then you qualify for the ridden finals. We will have 4 National Finals in 2023 – a pure and partbred section both in hand and ridden.

CHAMPION of CHAMPIONS

ALL our champions and reserves, from all the APHS 2021 events qualified for the “JRL Champion of Champions”, which was held at the end of the day at our Autumn Show.
