## APHS NORTHERN COUNTIES SHOW 2023

The APHS Northern Counties was held at Croft Top Equestrian Centre in Allerton on 30<sup>th</sup> April. Our judges for the day were Sir Chris Porter and Lynn Stainton. We had generous support from sponsors, so there were many prizes and awards given out during the course of the day, helping to make this a great show for all our Northern Foreign Breed and Concours exhibitors. Although the APHS shows have been established since 1988, we have only recently started offering classes in the north of the country – this is our second year of venturing to Lancashire.

At the show we saw a wide range of different foreign breeds – Morgan Horses, American Saddlebreds, Friesians, Warmbloods, Arabs, Hispanoarabs, Lusitanos, Spanish, Menorcan, American Miniatures, Fjord Horses, Haflingers and a number of partbreds too. Our Concours D'Elegance and fun classes were open to any breed and we saw great support in these classes too, with an amazing 14 horses entered in the Open Ridden Concours class. This concours class had an amazing array of costumes/attire, from Heritage through to the early 1900's and was clearly a crowd favourite.

The hospitality at Croft Top was amazing and with their café and seating overlooking the main indoor arena, spectators were able to view the show in the dry (yes we did have some rain unfortunately).

There were plenty of ribbons and awards to go round and not just to the class winners – many of our classes had additional awards for the "Best of" certain breeds, Best British Bred, Best Junior Rider and so on. All APHS shows are "all-inclusive" which means no-one goes home without a rosette, even if they are unplaced in their classes. The tag line for APHS is "Bringing together the best of showing from around the world" and that certainly happened at the Northern Counties Show.

The Menorcan Horse is very rare and there are few in this country, so it was a great boost for the breed to have the one Menorcan Horse (PRMe) at the show (Estuc, shown by Graham Jackson & Tracy Watson) win both the Purebred Foreign Breed In Hand Championship and the Purebred Ridden Championship. The veteran Haflinger Tina (owned and shown by Alicia Houlihan) also had a great day, winning their Gold Ticket to the VHS Championship Show. One of our youngest competitors, Rachel May Hunt, showing a PBA veteran Miss Petal, also had a good day, taking the Reserve spot in the Partbred Foreign Breed In Hand Championship.

As the pair won the Second Reserve in the same championship last year, we have all jokingly said that they need to make it a hat trick and go for the Champion spot in 2024 (no pressure!)

All in all it was an amazing show to run, we were able to donate £300 to our nominated charities (Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning and Dogs On The Streets UK) and we have already booked Croft Top again for our 2024 show (which will be held on Sunday 5th May 2024).

## **APHS FOREIGN BREEDS FESTIVAL SOLSTICE SHOW 2023**

The last Sunday in June saw the APHS Solstice Show taking place at White Horse Farm in Kent. A dedicated show for Foreign Breeds, this also had an extended open breed section with their own championships which was new for 2023. Although the weather was high 20's, the event was held indoors which meant it was nice and cool for all competitors. We are thankful to all our sponsors, our judges Vera Huddleston & Ian Martin, ring steward Alyce Clarke and of course to all the competitors that supported the event, as well as to White Horse Farm for allowing us to host this event at their wonderful yard. As always purebreds exceeded partbreds, but we saw a number of foreign breeds present – Arabs, American Shetlands, American Miniatures, Selle Francis, Warmbloods, Morgans, Comtois, Friesians, PREs, PRMe's & Lusitanos. We had 46 horses pre-entered and were able to donate £200 to our nominated charities from this show.

Our smallest horses held their own against their larger counterparts, with Suzie Grey's American Shetland, BMS Another Hershey Sweet Garenia, taking the Lightweight In Hand class, a second spot in the Mares/Fillies In Hand class and then standing second reserve in the Purebred In Hand Championship. Partbred American Miniature Haysden Scaramanga, owned by Jen Baldwin-Murphy won the Middle/Heavyweight In Hand class, was second in the Gelding In Hand class and then stood Foreign Breed Partbred Champion.

It was also a good day for our younger horses and riders. Ian Martin's CMUK Dreamcatcher, a Morgan Horse filly, won both the USA Breeds and the Mares/Fillies In Hand classes and then took the Reserve spot in the Foreign Breeds Purebred In Hand Championship. In the Open Breed section, we saw many youth exhibitors taking part, which is always encouraging. Charlotte Dunford on her pony Eeabrook Dante (who was our Supreme Amateur Champion in our end of season finals in 2022) won both the Youth Walk/Trot class and the Open Ridden class and then took the Second Reserve spot in the Open Ridden Championship. Thaya Russell on WHF Jelma has a second placing in one of her classes, won the Ridden Novice class, then pulled out all the stops to bag the Open Ridden Championship. Katie Snelling on Gasper De L'Heute had a win in the Open Walk/Trot class, then stood Reserve in the Open Ridden Championships. It was great to see all the junior riders growing in confidence throughout the day.

We had a number of special awards and prizes on offer at the show. The Veteran Horse Society ticket was won by Virginia Draper's 19 year old PRE-Fusion, Diamante Del Rey, who had the highest score from both the in hand and ridden veteran classes. PRMe UK, Caballos de Pura Raza Menorquina offered awards for the Best Menorcan Horse in both the in hand and ridden Iberian classes, which was won by Clare Shearer & Zaida. GBPRE also offered awards for the Best PRE in the same classes and these were won by Kirsty Glover's Aztec Ebano in the in hand class and Emma Nuttall's WHF Hispano in the ridden class.

Last mention must go to our "duo's" – horses that excelled both in the in hand and the ridden sections during the day. Emma Nuttall's PRE stallion, WHF Hispano won both the Purebred In Hand and the Purebred Ridden Championships (this isn't often achieved). We also saw Manda King's 8 year old Lusitano Partbred, Lots Of Love, take the Reserve Champion in the Partbred In Hand Championships then the Championship spot in the Partbred Ridden Championships.

Next year's show has already been booked and will be on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2024, at White Horse Farm again in Kent. We will be renaming the show the "APHS Invicta Show" next year, as a nod to the white horse of Kent and also our venue – please mark the date in your diary and we hope you can join us in 2024. 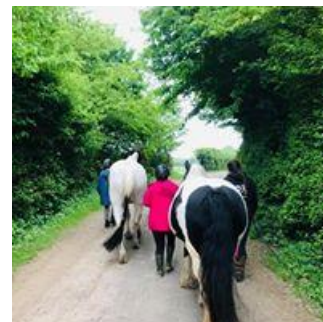




**TEAL (Therapeutic Equine Assisted Learning)** CIC was started in 2015 with the aim of providing a therapeutic setting in which horses help our clients overcome problems they are facing in their everyday lives.

This involves specially selected and trained horses and specialist staff, highly experienced in various special educational needs, particularly in autism. Lucy is qualified and trained in therapeutic equine assisted learning, counselling, mental health awareness, health and social care level 3, and first aid. TEAL staff have over 30 combined experience working with children with SEN needs, and over 22 years working with horses, using natural horsemanship techniques.

This is all delivered in a natural, non-clinical environment. TEAL is based in a beautiful countryside location in Kent. Being in natural environment's has been scientifically proven to improve people's well-being. TEAL deliver therapeutic assistance to a wide range of people, such as difficulties with traditional schooling, special educational needs, poor literacy & numeracy skills, learning difficulties, behavioural difficulties, communication and speech, change established behaviour patterns, learn new skills, confidence building, reducing anxiety, fine & Gross motor skills, concentration, relaxation, Increase self-confidence, Raise self esteem, Improve communication skills, Seek a different approach in dealing with depression, people in care homes with Huntington's, dementia and other associated disorders.



All our horses are wheelchair trained so we can lead from wheelchairs around the beautiful farm and still be groomed and painted even to those with restricted movement.

In 2017 we wrote our first educational course “basic stable care and horse management” the course is tailored to our students needs with lots of practical work and over learning of skills, we also run a level 2 “Grooms course” that gives all the students the skills needed to get into work in the equine industry and offer our students volunteering roles with us on completion of the course. For some of our students this will be the only qualification they will gain upon leaving education, for others this will be the only form of education they receive due to failed placements, we are currently looking to write a level 3 course.

TEAL horses are highly trained to work with our clients, 2 of our horses are rescues and our most recent rescue was SAM THE MAN in early 2019, Sam was a starvation case and has fitted into our herd really well and is a firm favourite with many of our younger clients.

A few weeks ago Sam began to work with a 5 year old who has autism and is/ was non-verbal.

During the first session as always we began grooming to affirm the friendship the clients build with the horses, the young boy was a little unsure and had a very short attention span, on our first walk out he refused to hold the lead rope and was more interested in jumping in the puddles during our walk, fast forward 5 weeks and now he leads Sam around the farm, over trotting poles in the sand school and we are all greeted verbally including the



ever so sweet sound of “ I love you Sam”, in a very short space of time the amazing power of horses has given this young boy his voice, a love for Sam and better attention to the task at hand.

Another of our students came to us for 2 weeks work experience in 2015 with the only knowledge of horses to be a few RDA lessons, she has been with us ever since, Molly has completed both of our courses, has worked on 2 other livery yards, still comes to us twice a week to volunteer.

Here is a testimonial from some of our residents at a care home we work with, our horses have also visited the home and gone into the rooms of those that are bed bound.

The residents of Birling House, enjoy attending TEAL!  
A typical time spent with TEAL.....

As we drive around the corner we can hear Ben neighing his greeting. The residents then get excited knowing that they have arrived. The residents all have huge smiles, knowing that Pudding is going to come out and say hello, if the weather is nice they enjoy taking her for a walk in the country, all being the ones that can lead her first. Then it is time to go back to the stables for grooming and painting Jigsaw, she is so good that sometimes she likes to rest her head on Marys neck to sleep! All the while Ben is trying to see around the corner and wondering why we haven't been to say hello yet. Soon it is time to go into the stables to have a scratch and a cuddle with Breeze and Ben, before we sadly have to leave. All of the residents of Birling house are excited and the horses are a calming influence on the residents who all enjoy talking to the horses, grooming and petting them, all of the horses are so gentle even the mighty Big Ben, who just wants a scratch of the nose! They enjoy giving them carrots and Mary enjoyed going for a ride when Jigsaw pulled her along in her wheelchair, laughing so hard that she didn't want to let go of the carrot.

It is so refreshing and makes our job worthwhile seeing Lucy and Lisa and the horses interacting with the residents, catching up and cuddling the horses we just do not want to leave and look forward to the next visit. It is an amazing place to visit for the residents, the staff, the horses and Lucy and Lisa who do an amazing job. This is not just a place to visit, TEAL is a place for the residents to visit their friends, because that is what Lucy, Lisa and the horses have become our favourite friends.

Over that last 2 years the money that has been raised by APHS shows has helped a number of our clients in providing full or part sessions and also funding part courses, without funding such as this TEAL could not be able to help as many clients as we do, from all of us at TEAL we would like to say a massive thank-you for your support.





## **APHS LONDON COUNTIES SHOW 2023**

Celebrating our 36<sup>th</sup> anniversary show, this year we didn't have a "summer" event instead had a big end of season show in September. This combination had a great day, winning the Native/Cob/Traditional In Hand Championship and then keeping cool under their gazebo (horse as well) this impressive youngster went on to be crowned Reserve Champion in the APHS Champion of Champions. Horses have spent the year qualifying for these finals, and we had an invited judge who has not judged at any of our events this year (including the London Counties show) to judge all our end of year finals. Within the Champion of Champions, Custom Made Bigwig also won the award for the Best Youngstock.

In the Novice Ridden class, Welsh Section C's took the top 2 spots, with Zoe Hepburn & Foxleigh's Inferno taking first place and Lily Himsowrth & Thistledown Ranger the 2<sup>nd</sup> spot. Sienna White's Zorro won the Ridden TGCA class and went on to be crowned Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Champion at the end of the showing day and Pat Fewster's Traditional, Bascote Percival, won both the In Hand and the Ridden Coloured N/C/T classes.

Emma Bishop & Hugo The Boss won the Ridden Coloured Non-Native class, the Ridden Riding Horse/Pony class and stood Second Reserve in the Veteran Finale as well as Champion in the Ridden Non-Native Championships. Eldest horse in the Veteran section was Victoria Strutton's 25 year old Sound Barrier. This duo won their in hand veteran age category and stood second in their ridden veteran age category class and finally were crowned APHS Veteran Finale Champion.

In the non-Native section we had a couple of horses stand out throughout the day. Debbie Bell-Urry's Moorfarm China Doll, a 3 year old filly, won the in hand coloured non-native class and then the largest class of the day, the 2&3 year old Youngstock class. Shown by Tom Clark for Debbie, this filly then went on to win the Partbred USA Breeds In Hand and the Non-Native In Hand Championship and was pinned Reserve Champion in the Foreign Breeds National Partbred In Hand Championship. Linda McGuire's RoR George Baker (GB), started the day with a win in the Plaited In Hand class with junior handler Preston Johnstone and then the Reserve Champion in the Non-Native In Hand Championship. GB went on to be crowned the Body Score Condition Champion for 2023. These awards were judged by Lingfield Vets and this is the second year in a row that GB has stood in the Championships – last year he stood Reserve and this year Champion. Then presented by Jamie Rashbrook, GB won the age section of their Veteran In Hand class and was crowned Reserve Champion in our Veteran Finale and also earned their VHS Gold Ticket.

In the hotly contested Concours D'Elegance class, Darcie Kilby with Max took top honours with Virginia Draper & Caprichoso Del Sol taking 2<sup>nd</sup> spot. Darcie and Max also won a large Open Walk/Trot class.

In the end of season Junior Ridden Championship Ellie Baker & Billy Socks stood champion having won their ticket earlier in the day in the Junior Rider 12-14 years class. Reserve was Poppy Bush & Hermit's Bolero, who qualified with a win in the Lead Line class.

Virginia & Caprichoso Del Sol also went on to stand top in the Iberian Partbred In Hand. Another Iberian (PRE) Quliate SB and Joy Loyla also had a great day, winning the Foreign Breeds



Parade class, the Ridden Iberian class and then stood Reserve Champion in the Foreign Breeds National Purebred Ridden Championship. Taking the Championship in the Foreign Breeds National Partbred Ridden Championship, was Manda King and her Partbred Lusitano Lots of Love – last year this combination won the In Hand Foreign Breed National Partbred Championship, so it was good to see them both back on top form.



The championship will be scheduled after the in hand classes and open to all – entry will remain free, you just need to have your 2024 award and be wearing an APHS September 2024 competitor number to take part.

You will need to have qualified to take part in any of the “Foreign Breed Finals” classes and also any of the “Foreign Breed Supreme

Championships” **PLUS you will also need to be an APHS-FBS member.** (We have plenty of classes at the event for non-qualified/non-members too).

We will have 4 Supreme National Championships in 2024 again – a pure and partbred section both in hand and ridden. For 2024 we will be offering prizes to all the Foreign Breed National Champions & Reserves and pinning to 6<sup>th</sup> place too. In addition, we will add to this list as we get sponsors and donations of prizes.

Other shows can also affiliate and be eligible for their class winners or champions to be eligible to come forward for our National Finals.
